Our Lodge Flag Procedures

I've been asked a number of times about when we display our flags. Most specifically the questions are, what time of day do they go up and taken down, and what are the dates/holidays?

The dates/holidays the lodge has been displaying it's 34 flags are, Presidents Day in February, Memorial Day in May, Flag Day in June, Independence Day in July, Labor Day in September, Veterans/Patriots Day in November and Pearl Harbor Day in December.

On these seven days we ask our members to help in displaying our flag. Around 6:30 AM we meet for coffee on the patio. At 7 AM "sharp" we start hoisting the flags with great reverence and care. After we complete the task, some people leave for breakfast or to begin their day, others stay and drain the coffee pots. At 5 PM sharp our volunteers are out taking our flags down. Now the fun begins, of course the lounge is open and the flags are piled on our patio tables ready to be folded. I can honestly say I have been in the military but never had the opportunity to fold our flag. On my first day of folding a flag I learned how to fold it properly. (Hint, Mary Aldrich is a good teacher.) Sometimes we have 8 members folding and other times it could be up to 20 Elks. The camaraderie is fun and you get a chance to work with many different people, which adds to the enjoyment.

One issue is important to know, it is the reason we start at 7 AM, and 5 PM "sharp". We are all volunteers, and many people are making a special effort to arrive in time for raising or lowering our flags. It is disheartening to drive up to the lodge and everything is done because we started early. That is a good way to lose volunteers!

Bobby Hurt is responsible for buying new flags. Monty Derting is responsible for inspecting flags for damage, storage of flags, moving all unserviceable flags to an appropriate outlet for their proper retirement and asking Bobby to order new flags.
