#### EXALTED RULER'S MESSAGE Robert Kielsa



Wow what a summer! I hope all our members had a happy and healthy summer! Phyllis and I attended the Elks National Convention in San Antonio, Texas. What a turn out, 8466 Elks registered for the event. I did learn that the Arizona Elks are, at least in my mind, the loudest state in attendance. With our red vests, Arizona flags and our extremely loud voices, we were a hard group to miss. We voted on 15 resolutions of which 12 passed. The one resolution that did not pass, which I had hoped would, was "to allow

initiations to be held in a special service where non-members can attend as guests". The vote was 1301 for and 1874 against the resolution. Maybe next year it will pass. As I indicated in my June report, I had a personal goal to see the Alamo. I'm happy to report I was able to achieve my goal!

I'm pleased to report that the Night Under the Stars event will be on Saturday, October 27th. Our music will be provided by the Greg Spivey Band. We will again have a raffle which will provide for \$500, \$300 and \$200 prize money. Tickets have been included in this Bugle. You will also be able to purchase more tickets at the lodge and the evening of the event.

What a wild ride, on Friday, August 17th the Queen of Hearts was finally uncovered on the 52nd week of the game. Our winner, Jeffery Osborn won a total of \$25,427.87. A total of \$41,748.85 was given out in winnings to our members throughout the 52 weeks. In addition, \$11,255 was given out to our community, youth activities and our veterans. A new game started on Friday, August 24th with an approximate \$3,000 prize.

Yes you did hear right, the Board of Directors formed an exploratory committee. The committee is working a five "5" year plan in which expansion of our current building is one option. The upfront items are to prepare our property for any eventuality by upgrading the infrastructure. This includes moving the septic tank, installing a hydrant, addressing our parking issues, contracting for a development plan, and becoming well versed with state, county and fire department regulations so we can make informed decisions. Once the plan is set, our members will be solicited for input and ideas as to what our lodge should look like.

### Catalina Mountain Supports Wheelchair Games Athletes By Pat Cox

Catalina Mountain Elks Lodge #2815 hosted a send-off luncheon on Saturday, July 21 for six Arizona veterans who attended the 38<sup>th</sup> National Wheelchair Games in Orlando, Florida, July 31-August 4. The purpose of the Wheelchair Games is to encourage veterans with physical disabilities to become aware of their potential while promoting a spirit of healthy activity and camaraderie. It was apparent from the stories that the athletes shared that a bond of solidarity was formed from their experiences.
