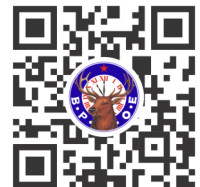

Bi-Law Changes to be Voted on at the September 10th Lodge Meeting

The following By-law and House Rules changes have been approved by the Board of Directors. They will be placed on the Bulletin Board, published in the September Newsletter and voted on at our first regular meeting in September.

Article V: Elective Officers and Duties Of the Secretary

Section 4 Paragraph 6 now reads in part:

For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation \$6,300 per annum, payable monthly.

Shall read: For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation \$6,900 per annum, payable monthly.

Article V: Elective Officers and Duties Of the Treasurer

Section 5 now reads in part: For the faithful performance of his duties, shall receive as compensation \$5,400 per annum, payable monthly.

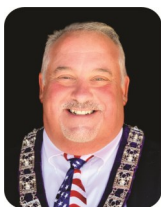

Hello everyone, The Elks National Applications for Elks National Foundation Scholarships Now Open. Since 1931, the Elks National Foundation has helped students recognize their academic dreams. This year, they will award nearly \$5.8 million in college scholarships to at least 900 outstanding, service-minded high school seniors. With these scholarships, students receive more than financial aid; they receive an invitation to join the #ElksFamily. For Legacy scholars, the Elks have always been part of the family. Awarded to children or grandchildren of Elks, this scholarship requires recipients to serve with an Elks Lodge three times over the four years they receive the scholarship. In 2026-27, Legacy Awards increased in both quantity and amount awarded;



400 Legacy scholars received \$6,000 scholarships. Ranging from \$1,000 to \$7,500 per year, Most Valuable Student scholarships are open to high school seniors who will be pursuing a four-year degree, on a full-time basis, in an accredited United States college or university. No relation to the Elks is necessary to apply. Five hundred four-year scholarships will be awarded to the highest-rated ap-

plicants in the 2027 competition. As they enter the next stages of their life, the class of 2027 Elks scholars will feel a wide range of emotions; with their new #ElksFamily, they will never feel alone. The brunch was especially meaningful as it was dedicated to the memory of Larry Henley, whose lifelong commitment to serving others and passion for fundraising continue to inspire our Major Projects Committee. Larry's legacy of giving back lives on through the work we do and the lives we touch. Thanks to the incredible generosity of everyone who attended and supported the event, we raised more than \$2,200 for Arizona Elks Major Projects. Guests enjoyed a delicious brunch featuring charcuterie boards and breakfast favorites, many of which were generously donated by our members and guests. We are especially grateful to everyone who contributed home-made dishes, donated raffle baskets and raffle prizes, and volunteered their time to help make the morning such a success. A special highlight of the brunch was a beautiful live viola performance by Aiden Chavez, whose music provided the perfect backdrop throughout the event.
