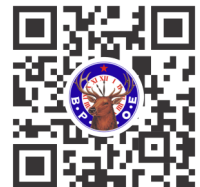

Proposal for Preliminary Work on the Future Home of Catalina Mountain 2815

This proposal will define the scope, work products, period of performance and cost to perform the necessary planning, architectural designs and drawings, to include building placement, floor plans and parking areas. Also to ensure the property meets all state and county requirements, to make all applications for, and ensure all utilities such as water, sewage, fire and electrical power are available sufficient to support the proposed structure. Construction which will begin in 3 to 5 years and is envisioned as a 9,000 sq. ft. addition/expansion connecting our existing Lodge building and existing rental building. Majority of the work will be performed by Williams West Homes, a well vetted contractor and home builder.

Cost of this proposal shall not exceed \$85,000. Period of performance will be 9/15/2025 through 9/15 2026. The Board of Directors will be responsible for planning, oversight and budget associated with project.

Funding for this preliminary phase, in pursuit of a more suitable home for Catalina Mountain 2815, shall be provided by the Lodge's restricted Catalina Future Home account. The lodge shall incur no debt; operational funds shall not be affected and there will be no change to existing Lodge or House budgets, no Lodge savings or contingency funds will be used. The restricted Catalina Future Home account was created specifically for expansion of our current facility, new construction or purchase of a new building. This is the first phase in achieving that goal. The account currently has assets of approx. \$240,000.

**A vote on this measure will be taken at our next regular meeting that will be held on
Thursday, July 24, 2025.**
