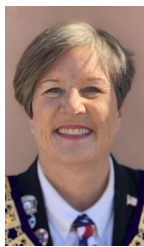

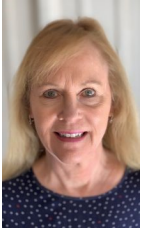
### Elks of the Month

gratulations to the many weekly winners, and don't forget the 50/50 on Friday, starting April 16.

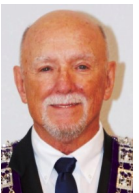

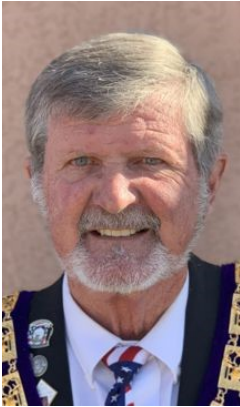

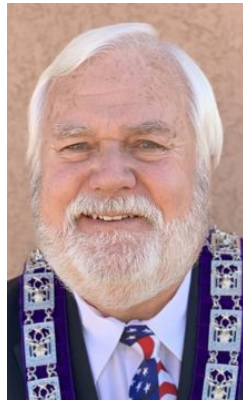
