

If you go to [elks2815.org](http://elks2815.org) you will see the complete two part report. Part One is the 4 page Summary of the total survey; Part Two is the six pages of the Verbatim Written Responses. Part Two is broken down by "W" Women, "M" Men and age groups 21 to 35, 36 to 50, 51 to 66 and 67 and over.

The report has one of the most positive outcomes I have ever seen in a survey. There are a number of suggestions which fall in the House Committee's area of responsibility. Two suggestions belong to the Exalted Ruler and the largest number of comments/suggestions are for the Board of Directors.






