Wow, June was a spectacular month for generating clothes for our veterans. I'm happy to say our lodge has amassed and delivered \$23,269 men's and women's clothing, books and miscellaneous (small travel size) toiletries for the Southern Arizona VA Health

Care. All this has been accomplished from April 1st, the start of Gloria's ER year! Our next two collection dates are Wednesday, July 10th at 1 PM, and Wednesday, August 14th at 1 PM on the back patio.

We would like to remind all of our travelers, staying at motels while on their summer journeys, please save up and bring in all your unused mini toiletries for our homeless veterans.

As I've mentioned in the past, our homeless veterans need new underwear, back packs and socks. Our familiar green barrel will remain in the lounge for whatever you wish to contribute.

As I mentioned in the June report the HUD - VASH program is specifically designed to help veterans and their families transition into housing. These veterans receive food stamps; however, the stamps do not cover cleaning products. Specifically they need the following supplies: Toilet Paper, Dish Soap, Sponges, Wash Cloths, Laundry Soap, Paper Towels, Brooms, Mops, Dust Pans, Liquid Floor Cleaner, Small Trash Cans and Trash Bags. You may use the green barrel in the lodge for any donations you are be able to make. Or, if you prefer, you may drop big items off in the Veterans Pod in our parking lot.

Dates to remember:

- 1. Mark your calendars, we have a welcome back luncheon scheduled for our Paralyzed Veterans on Saturday, July 27th.
- 2. You will have an opportunity to see two new veterans ceremonies this year. The first is the POW/MIA ceremony on Friday, September 20th at 9 AM.
- 3. The second new ceremony will be on Veterans Day November 11th at 10 AM. Both events are open to the public.

Howdy! Summer finally is here, and soon the monsoons will make the Catalinas a beautiful green.

As I have been discussing in past Bugle articles, we are going to go live with our Credit Card program starting 1.July!! As with any new system, I am asking that everyone have a little extra pa-

tience as we get used to the system. Here are a few points that will make this process easier for everyone:

All sales in the lounge that are rung up on the register are eligible for Credit charge. There will be a \$10 minimum for Credit/Debit card transactions

The system will accept both Credit and Debit cards. However, we will not be offering the choice to get cash back on debit card transactions. In the future we will also accept Apply Pay, but at first we will stay with traditional cards

When paying by card, you will have to come to the corner of the bar where the machine is located, by the cash register, as you will have to sign on the device. You can also add a tip either in an amount of % of the total. When you have completed the transaction, you can elect to get a receipt, by following the prompts on the device. We will be training the Bar Stewards the week of 24.June so things will be good to go on Monday, 1.July.

The Queen of Heart continues to grow, even with several large payouts! Congrats to those lucky winners, but the Queen of Hearts is still hiding behind one of the few remaining cards. With the larger pot, we are getting more visitors hoping to find the Queen, which is great? However, please remember that if you are visiting, to sign the visitor book, and to show the Bar Steward your current Elks Membership card. This will help avoid any misunderstandings, which we have had recently, and to improve the speed of service from the Stewards. In addition, you must be an Elk in good standing and have your signed Elks Card in order to purchase Queen of Hearts tickets.

Don't forget our Christmas in July on the 20th at 4pm. Bring a wrapped gift and have fun watching the exchange of the most wanted gifts! We had a blast in December so you will want to make sure that you participate this time!!

Here is an early "Save the Date" we are planning this year's Night Under the Stars and it is tentatively set for 26.Oct. This is the largest event that we do each year and is sure to sell out quickly, so you will want to sign up early. It will be a great night of great food and live music. Normandy, France – June 5 and 6, 2019 By Jerry Wilkerson: Low hanging steel blue clouds pushed inland along the coast of Normandy on Wednesday, June 5, as final preparations for the 75th anniversary of D-Day was underway. In France, an unfriendly layer of marine breeze met my face, as I looked out at the choppy English Channel in the early dawn hours. There was a pale impatient morning glow obsessing on the horizon. Lights were winking on in small towns and villages up and down the coast. At that moment, it was eerily quiet while this writer gathered his thoughts, hopes, and prayers for such a historic occasion. Locals were going about their business as people from around the world were assembling for the many memorials scheduled over the next 48 hours. Old warriors from the past in wheelchairs, with walkers, and canes saluted each other with gnarled, trembling hands. Relics of uniforms from long ago were dedicatedly presented by the assemblage with great decency. Tears were abundant as they gazed out to the sea, minds full of memories recalling their experiences in this very place so long ago. These last living military heroes from D-Day realized they may never come this way again because of age and health. It was indeed a legion of honor. I was humbled by their sacrifice, spirit, and the very soul of their existence. The following day, the actual day of the invasion precisely 75 years ago, morning clouds gave way to a mostly sunny sky and warmer temperatures. In a way, it seemed to be God's great gift to mankind so that those assembled could remember in peace the glory of their being and what was accomplished across this part of the world after a continent lost its freedom. In the small towns, villages, and fields dotting the Normandy coast old, thin roads were jammed with people and vehicles. Most folks just parked where they could and walked the rest of the way to the cliffs overlooking all the vast landing beaches while crossing in the footsteps of retreating German soldiers as they fled their former stronghold shore defense line 75 years ago. That was when the war turned, and the Nazi's were forced out of France and back towards Berlin. Observances included a 21-cannon salute. There were fly-overs with antique, vintage and current aircraft, some trailing red, white, and blue contrails. Even parachutists jumped from WWII Airborne airplanes filling the sky with splendid round chutes dimpling across the landscape. Flags from participating countries snapped in the breeze, and beautiful floral wreaths were in abundance. At COLLEVILLE-SUR-MER, France, the American cemetery, the days' formal ceremony was held with heads of state, most who did not serve in the military, offering opinions and dialogues. The speakers provided commentary on their view of history, honor, duty, and value of sacrifice. Current military men and women in uniform attended to the old veterans who had returned to this killing field likely for the last time for a most glorious of glory days. Behind this seated group were the iconic 9,300 white crosses in perfect rows, splayed out for acres overlooking the beach below and the bright blue ocean. Men were on their knees in the green grass next to the stone markers, citing prayers, and moments of a personal note. And there were the two most beautiful, stately white flag poles on each side of the cemetery, the tallest I have ever witnessed, with immense American flags casting an ever-loving eye upon the lads interred below. They turned the tide of war, these gallant men. One hopes we, as a society of mankind, may never be forced to do it again. Standing silently, I listened to the stories, the personal memories of battle from these men and realized how small I am in their stead. But pride has no standing as to size, and the virtuoso of pride that I felt was well beyond my humble self.




