I'm happy to say, as of May 23rd, our lodge has generated \$14,291 in men's and women's clothing, books and miscellaneous (small travel size) toiletries for the Southern Arizona VA Health Care. Our next collection date is Wednesday, June 12th at 1 PM on the back patio.

We would like to remind all of our travelers, staying at motels while on their summer journeys, please save up and bring in all your unused mini toiletries for our homeless veterans.

In our May report I mentioned the need to help our homeless veterans as we head into our "HOT" summer months. I'm happy to report that we were able to collect and deliver to the vet homeless 18 undershorts and 39 pairs of socks. Thank you to all of our contributors! Our familiar green barrel will remain in the lounge for whatever you wish to contribute.

During my last delivery to the Veterans building 90 I met a person who works for HUD - VASH, a program specifically designed to help veterans and their families transition into housing. These veterans receive food stamp; however, the stamps do not cover cleaning products. I was able to connect with the Program Coordinator of this program and she gave me the following list of supplies needed: Toilet Paper, Dish Soap, 3. Sponges, Wash Cloths, Laundry Soap, Paper Towels, Brooms, Mops, Dust Pans, Liquid Floor Cleaner, Small Trash Cans and Trash Bags. You may use the green barrel in the lodge for any donations you may be able to make. Or, if you prefer, you may drop big items off in the Veterans Pod in our parking lot.

Dates to remember:

You will have an opportunity to see two new veterans ceremony this year. The first is the POW/MIA ceremony on Friday, September 20th at 9 AM. The second ceremony will be on Veterans Day November 11th at 10 AM. Both events are open to the public.

Mark your calendars, we have a welcome back luncheon scheduled for our Paralyzed Veterans on Saturday, July 27th.

Catalina Mountain Elks Youth Week Awards By Pat Cox

Catalina Mountain Elks Lodge #2815 honored students at a celebration marking Elks National Youth Week in May. Youth Activities Coordinator Lisa Chavez organized the youth awards program and acted as master of ceremonies.

MCAT High School Principal Denise Coronado from the Marana Unified School District was guest speaker. The school offers a personalized educational experience that provides students with a variety of career options for earning a diploma in a more flexible program of study than a traditional school environment.

The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks National Foundation recognizes top high school graduates from across the country with \$2.5 million in scholarship awards. The scholarships are awarded based upon the student's academic achievements, leadership skills, extracurricular activities, participation in community services, and financial need. Within the southern district alone, there are 34 high schools. Five of these schools are in the Catalina Mountain Elks Lodge jurisdiction. Lodge Scholarship Chairman Roger Mastro presented \$1,600 scholarships to two outstanding high school seniors, Joseph Weichsel, Canyon Del Oro High School, and McKinley Severson, Pusch Ridge Christian Academy. Both scholarship recipients plan to attend the University of Arizona.

The Catalina Mountain Elks Lodge also awarded a total of \$4,000 in scholarships distributed among five students pursuing higher education or technical training. The students receiving these awards were Peggy Brownlee, University of Arizona; Travis Dobbin, University of Notre Dame; Madison Johnson, Grand Canyon University; Lili Oland, University of Arizona; and, Aaron Peck, Butler University.

Six students from Coronado Middle School in Catalina were the winners of the Catalina Mountain Elks Americanism Essay Contest. This year's theme was "Why Veterans Are Our Heroes." Lodge Americanism Coordinator Al Peterson presented certificates to three students in Division I and three students in Division II.

Chairman Larry Wittenborn presented certificates to the winners of the Soccer Shoot and Hoop Shoot events.
