I'm so happy to tell you that since April 1st, and with the help of many Elks, we have delivered \$39,900 in material and financial donations for our local veterans. A BIG THANK YOU to everyone who have so generously donated clothing, books and

toiletries for our veterans! Travelers, don't forget the small toiletries from your motels/hotels. Our next collection is on Wednesday, November 13th at 1 PM on the patio.

Our perennial green barrel is in the lounge for any donations you wish to make for either the homeless vets transitioning to some sort of housing who need such things as toilet paper, laundry and dish soap, paper towels, washcloths, trash bags, mops/brooms and floor cleaner; or to our homeless vets still on the streets. They need new t-shirts, socks, underwear and back packs. Bigger items may be placed in the POD in the parking lot. The POD is always unlocked and you are welcome to drop off any contributions in it.

With Christmas approaching, it is time to think about event item six (6) below and prepare for visiting our veterans at the hospital and presenting them with small gifts. As we've done in the past, please buy new t-shirts, socks, underwear, outer wear shirts to be distributed to veterans in the VA hospital. The Christmas party at the hospital this year is on Friday, December 13th. So all gifts need to be new, wrapped and tagged with info on size, description and if for a female or male. We would need all gifts in the lodge by Wednesday, December 11th.



### Catalina Mountain Elks Dictionary Project

Catalina Mountain Elks Lodge #2815 Dictionary Project Chairperson Joyce Garcia, ER Gloria Cisneros and lodge members Deborah Derting and Mimi Wittenborn distributed 160 dictionaries to third-grade students at Casa Christian, Copper Creek, Immaculate Heart, and Mesa Verde elementary schools in Oro Valley. Joyce has made this worthwhile endeavor her personal project by funding the cost of all dictionaries for many years.

The Dictionary Project was founded in 1995 by a South Carolina teacher, Mary French. Her sole mission was to distribute dictionaries to as many third-grade students as possible. In 2002, the project was expanded to 12 states along the eastern seaboard, including New York. The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks proudly joined in the effort and now provides dictionaries to third-graders in all 50 states.




