I had the privilege to attend the 157th Grand Lodge Convention in Atlanta, Georgia, over the Fourth of July weekend. What an experience! More than 6,000 Elks attended the convention from all of the states, and Arizona was there in our red vests, right up front, Arizona flags waving, loud and proud!

## Grand Lodge Resolutions

2022-01: To add the Secretary and Treasurer to the Board of Directors.

2022-02: To reduce the burden of storage of hundreds of years of physical paperwork by allowing for digital storage of documents.

2022-03: To eliminate the age requirement in part (a) of Section 14.260.

2022-04: To create, establish, and codify a new Elks National Drug Awareness Commission, to better support and promote the programs of the Order.

2022-05: To provide the Grand Exalted Ruler with the ability to protect Members, guests, and property when a Member acts or threatens to act in an egregious manner.

Greetings! Hopefully everyone has had a good summer and managed to escape the heat and enjoy the monsoon season. Even though things are quieter in the summer, the Lodge hasn't slowed down much. Game 9 of the *Queen of Hearts* game went to the 53rd card and culminated with Bob Hoffman selecting the Queen on July 17th. Thank you all who support this game. Game 9 resulted in winner prizes totaling \$47,106; charitable endeavors of the game totaled \$9,888. So far, Game 10 has also resulted in two Queens being selected, with payments to winners exceeding \$1,000. This is a great fundraiser that not only benefits the Lodge, but also our participants.

Earlier this summer, we received a request from the Nurses office at Coronado School in Catalina. The school district has no budget for snacks or water used by the Nurses Office. For the second year, the PERA has purchased nearly 10 cases of water and other supplies for the Nurses Office. When Steve and I were delivering the supplies, Health Assistant, Lea Hagin, mentioned that the school flags needed to be replaced and that the school maintenance supervisor made a request in May for new flags, but had not heard anything back. The PERA also agreed to purchase new flags for the school. Also in August, the PERA also awarded *Boy Scout Troop 211* \$1,000 to help them purchase camping equipment.



Our summer months have been good with respect to our Veteran donations. Our non cash donations, which is used clothing and shoes, sits at \$93,325 as of 8/20/22. Our cash donations total \$5,168 to date bringing our total donations to \$98,493.

One of our biggest cash donations was for the Paralyzed Veterans attending their annual games. This year those games were held in Phoenix. PER **Gloria Cisneros** volunteered at the games and brought back some great stories and photos. The **Veterans Committee** held a luncheon on July 23rd to welcome our Veterans back, and we really enjoyed them recounting their adventures! (Please see some photos taken at the luncheon below.) We covered transportation, lodging expenses, and the luncheon. Our pledge of \$5,000 to our Veterans participating in the *Paralyzed Veterans Annual Games* ended up at \$4,168. We have been helping our Paralyzed Veterans for a number of years now and, sadly, the coach for the group participating in the games passed away earlier this year. Because **Karen Gialle** was such an important contributor to these games your PERs have decided to establish a *Memorial Fund*, in Karen's name, for our Paralyzed Veterans. More information on the fund will be provided at a later date.

We sent out 17 more used cell phones to be refurbished and given to our active military. Thank you to all our phone donors!



I had the wonderful opportunity to meet and talk to Teen Morgan, a member of Lodge #385. Teen has been associated with the Veterans Committee at her Lodge and told me about a project she has used to raise funds for their Veterans Committee. Because we need to establish more revenue streams for our Veteran initiatives, I would like to explore the idea of establishing a committee to sew and knit items needed for Veterans and for us to sell at the Lodge. - 2022-07: The purpose of this amendment is to ensure that the Grand Exalted Ruler has sufficient time to analyze the objections made by a Member, Lodge or State Association that are subject to an executive order.
- 2022-08: To eliminate the age requirement in part (a) of Section 14.260.
- 2022-09: The purpose of this amendment is to provide authority for local Lodge Committees and Subcommittees to meet by electronic means.
- 2022-10: The purpose of this amendment is to clarify that an unaffiliated Member, who is the current spouse of a Member, may visit a Lodge and attend events of the Order in a manner consistent with the status of a spouse who has never been a Member of the Order.
- 2022-11: The purpose of this amendment is to authorize electronic submittal of forms in the permitting process.


