In mid-January, I attended the Arizona Elks South District Leading Knight clinic. Various committee chairs and district leaders put on a clinic to help guide/advise Leading Knights for their upcoming year as Exalted Ruler. I am excited about the opportunity to become the Exalted Ruler of our wonderful lodge. Nominations for officers will be held at the lodge

meeting on February 8th. Voting will be held at the lodge meeting on February 22nd. The February 8th meeting will be led by many of our Past Exalted Rulers; the meeting is typically a fun one. Installation of officers for the new lodge year will be on Saturday, March 27th. Further information about installation and the related festivities will be in next month's Bugle.

The State Elks National Foundation Chair spoke to us about ENF. I have also talked about ENF in past articles this year. When we make donations to ENF above certain per capita thresholds, lodges become eligible for grants to help in our communities. In addition, the Arizona Elks Association receives funding from ENF based upon all Arizona Elk Member donations.

Thanks to our lodge member's generosity, we were able to receive \$8,000 in grants since April 1, 2020. Jan Trudeau's Community Activities article will explain how we used one of our current grants this last month. The lodge also has funds from grant waiting in the wings for a Veteran's Project.

At the state level, ENF supports Scholarships (typically about \$100,000), Arizona Elks Major Projects (\$150,000 in 2020), Veteran's Hospital and Veteran's Home programs, Drug Awareness, Hoop Shoot, and Social Welfare programs. ENF financial support of the Arizona Elks Major projects covers overhead meaning Elk donations to AEMP goes 100% to our two State Major Projects (Steele Children's Center and the Youth Camp).

Donating to the Elks National Foundation can be made in several ways. Dues Statements will be arriving sometime in February. The statement will include lines for voluntary deductions for Elks National Foundation, Arizona Elks Major Projects, and lodge funds for the Veteran's Committee, Scholarship Committee, and Bugle Boosters. Please think about supporting our Elk Charities. Another easy way to make donations to ENF is through the Fidelity Club. Members of the Fidelity Club make monthly donations automatically using direct bank account debit or use of credit card. ENF has a plethora of information available at www.elks.org. Registration for the Fidelity club is also on the elks.org website. Arizona Elks Major Projects also has a Diamond Club for members to make automatic monthly donations at www.azelksmp.com.
