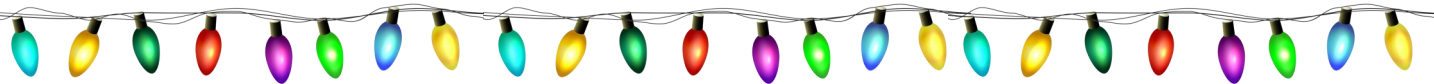
This month's shoutout goes to Betty Cook, who coordinates the holiday decoration every year at the

As of this publication, on December 3, we have already escorted the children on a shopping spree for clothes. We met at the Walmart Garden Department at 8:30 am.

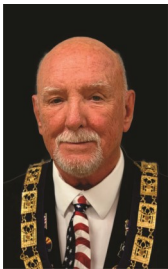

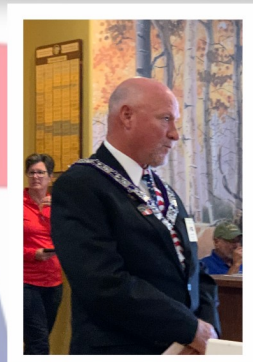
