
Exalted Ruler's Message - Alane Asp





THE IDEA OF AN ELKS FLAG DAY SERVICE WAS FIRST SUGGESTED IN 1907 AND OFFICIALLY MANDATED IN 1911. IT WAS NOT UNTIL 1949 THAT THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES SIGNED PUBLIC LAW 203 DESIGNATING JUNE 14 AS FLAG DAY. THUS, THE ELKS WAS NOT ONLY THE FIRST FRATERNAL ORGANIZATION TO CELEBRATE FLAG DAY, BUT HAD MADE THIS CEREMONY MANDATORY MANY YEARS BEFORE IT BECAME A NATIONAL DESIGNATED DAY TO CELEBRATE THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE "BIRTH OF THE AMERICAN FLAG."
