As of October 14th, nearly \$2,500 has been raised. I was amazed to learn the Mud Girls raised \$280 auctioning three pies. Thank you girls for running the mud obstacle course and thank you members for supporting them. A final fundraising tally will be included next month; these funds will help our Veterans Committee do more things for the Veterans like supporting the Homeless Program at the VA. On October 5th, two social workers at the VA Homeless Program accepted about \$1,400 worth of food and new clothing for the program. It was wonderful for Steve and me to hear how excited they were. Steve and I are becoming good at delivering items for our Veterans. We also delivered more than \$500 worth of underwear and socks for Veterans to the Mid-Year Convention in Tempe.

November 11th is *Veterans Day*. The Veterans Committee will be hosting a *complimentary breakfast* for all Veterans and guests from 8:30 to 9:30 am, and our officers will be performing the Veterans Day Ceremony at 10:00 am. Flags will also be raised at 7:00 am and lowered/folded at 5:00 pm; volunteers are always appreciated. Non-Veterans may join us for breakfast for a donation.

We have many social activities in the works, with many Saturdays having multiple activities. On Sundays, the Lounge has food and *NFL Football*—courtesy of the NFL Football package provided by the **PERA**. I'm again very happy to report our *Veterans* donations, as of 10/21/21, total \$83,397 for our Lodge year! Thank you to all of our members who have donated clothing, new and used, as well as money to help our Veterans!

As a reminder, the Pod in the parking lot is always unlocked and your men's and women's clothing is always welcome. The new Veterans services we use for our donations also accepts new toiletries and unopened home cleaning supplies. The donations we make may be used by *Homeless Veterans* or *Veteran families* transitioning into housing.

As our season changes to cooler temperatures, our *Homeless Vets* will need warmer clothes. Sweatshirts, jackets, or heavy shirts that you can donate would be very helpful. Because of the COVID19 protocol instituted at the Veterans campus, only new clothes will be accepted. However, I have found a second Veterans organization that will take used clothing. So, if you wish to donate new clothing, please make sure the bag is identified as such and drop it off in the green barrel in the Lounge.

I just want to remind you that our Lodge has two new programs designed to support our military and Veterans.

The first program is <u>Recycle Cell Phones</u> for our troops. Since 2004, this organization has recycled more than 30 million devices, and

have provided more than 400 million free minutes by sending more than 5 million calling cards to our service personnel overseas.

You can donate by dropping your used cell phones at the Lodge or providing cash or a check (made out to *Catalina Mountain Elks Lodge #2815* "Veterans phones"). Place in an envelope marked Veterans Committee in the Cell Phone box in the Lounge, or the money donation jar on the bar. Calling cards may be donated the same way.

Our second program is through an organization called *Intrepid Hospice*. They are looking for volunteers willing to spend 30 to 45 minutes with those who have a short time left here on earth. One of the worst fears everyone experiences during this dying process is dying alone. You can make a difference. (*continued on page 6*)

Children's Research Center. He requested these items be brought to the Mid-Year Convention in October. After the Veterans Committee stepped up, I delivered to the convention three large boxes of new socks and underwear, plus \$300 in Target gift cards that the PERA purchased (see below).

When we first started the *Queen of Hearts* game, the PERA established that we had to use a percentage of our profit from sales for charitable donations. We also indicated that a percentage could also be used for Lodge necessities and/or improvement. As reported earlier, the Lodge has committed a sum of money for Lodge improvements. The

PERA has committed an additional \$3,000 to that fund to provide an Elk statue to be displayed in front of our

building. Look for it in early December.

There is a team of ladies, who I'm sure you will read about later, who call themselves the "Mud Girls." They are participating in a muddy obstacle course in an effort to raise money for the Veterans Committee. To date, they have exceeded their \$1,500 goal, but they would appreciate more. The PERA has promised to donate \$200 to their cause.

fun. We have had several small winners this month with \$50 cards chosen, but we also had one of the Aces chosen, in which the winner received 10% of the pot. 
