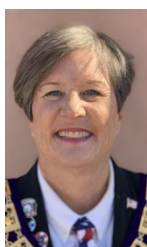

## Mud Girls Running for Veterans Fund

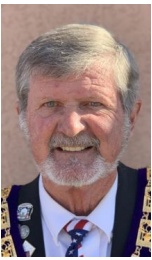



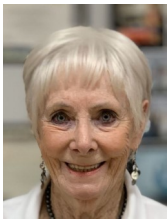
