Howdy! As I start my next role as PER president, I wanted to at least keep my greeting the same. What a great way to start my time with the PER Association with Lobsterfest. I was impressed by the teamwork to feed 108 people in 90 minutes! From what I saw, the Lobsters never stood a chance. The carnage was impressive, and I think everyone enjoyed a great meal. I will update everyone on the event's financial results as soon as possible. Outside of Queen of Hearts this is the largest fundraiser for the PER Association and helps us fund the youth scholarships and other projects at the Lodge. A friendly reminder that you must have a valid membership card (paid your dues) and PLEASE make sure that your name is legible, and there is a phone number on each ticket. I did notice that my first time selling, there were a few tickets with just a name. If a ticket without a number is picked, it will be discarded, and another "properly filled- out" ticket will be selected.



For the last decade, donations to Friends of Pima Animal Care Center have fueled innovative animal lifesaving programs, providing care and hope for countless animals and pet-loving families. This local nonprofit organization has helped more than 75,000 families with veterinary care, behavioral support, supplies, and pet-friendly guidance. The Pima Animal shelter is located at 400 N. Silverbell in Tucson and needs our help. With money from generous Elks, we can ensure that the pets in the shelter are well taken care of. All donations go directly to the care of animals and not to the salaries of employees of the center. The House Committee's goal is to buy items for the shelter from their wish lists (Amazon and Chewy) and then present an itemized list of what we were able to buy. ENF Report - Ron Starjnski, PER



In the 2026-27 fiscal year, the Elks National Foundation is taking its commitment to Elks communities further than ever before. In celebration of America 250, the Spotlight Grant amount has increased to \$2,500 from \$2,000! With this increase, Lodges are eligible for up to \$11,500 in Community Investments Program grants to help build stronger communities. Additionally, in April the ENF awarded 400 four-year, \$6,000 scholarships to the children and grandchildren of Elks through the Legacy Awards scholarship competition—both an increase in the number of scholarships (to 400 from 350) and the amount of the awards (to \$6,000 from \$4,000). Our Lodge, Catalina Mountain Lodge # 2815, ended the 2025-2026 year at #1 the state for Per- Member Donations @ \$42.19 and #3 in total donations of \$24,596.80. We tried hard but just missed our goal of \$200,000 for our veteran donations for our 2025/2026 Elk year. Your lodge contributed \$135,886 in non cash contributions (used clothing, books, sporting goods and shoes). Our cash donations equaled \$24,000 and Welcome Home Kits hit \$36,289. Our total donations totaled \$196,175 just short of our goal by \$3,825. Our best year yet! A BIG thank you to our Veterans Committee and our Membership! As I write this report we are one week away from our 4th Dart Tournament. We had 25 Items for our members to bid on this year. The total value of these donated items hit \$8,000 this year! This is one of two fund raisers the Veterans Committee does each year and the committee is so very thankful for our membership's generosity! As we hit Spring our homeless

veterans are in need of a number of things we can contribute that will help with their comfort and health. All canned like chili, soup, stew, tuna, chicken, spam, fruit cups, with pop up tops, are needed. Crackers, trail mix, beef jerky, Gatorade, bottles of water and individual bags of chips/crackers/snacks, protein bars, cookies, canned fruit and small packaged fruit drinks are helpful. mouthwash in smaller bottles, toothpaste and brushes, lip balm, sunscreen and hats are needed as well. Backpacks, small amount gift cards to grocery stores and fast food are also very helpful. As far as clothing goes we need new Undershorts, T-shirts (Med, Lg, XL), jeans (W 33, 34, 36), long sleeve shirts and socks. Please place all NEW items, along with food, in the White barrel in the lounge. As always, a big thank you for your continued support for our veterans!
