

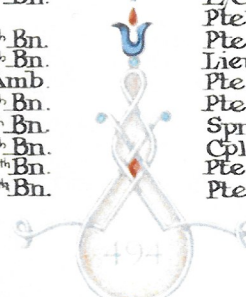

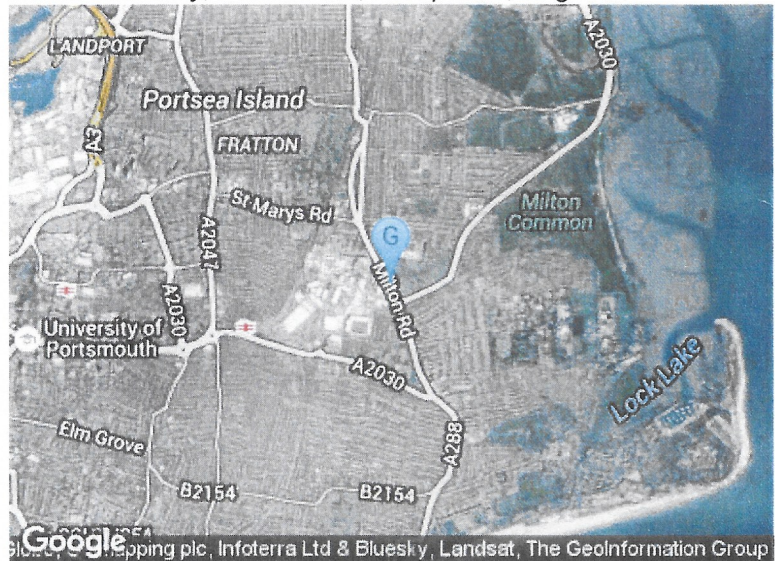
1051463 Private (5th Battalion, Saskatchewan Regiment) George Rose (b.1896) of Saskatoon died 19180914 of wounds to the leg and groin sustained more than a month earlier and is buried at Milton cemetery, Portsmouth, Hampshire, England. George was the son of Pierce Rose of Arnold's Cove, Newfoundland, and was a labourer when he enlisted at Saskatoon late in 1916.
