Variety of champions from several schools at Marmonte League Track and Field Finals

The Westlake High boys team won six individual titles and one relay title, the Thousand Oaks boys team won four individual titles, and the Thousand Oaks and Newbury Park girls teams each captured four individual titles at the Marmonte League Track and Field Track Finals on Thursday at Westlake High.

For the Westlake boys, Lawson Grace swept the throwing events, winning the shot put with a heave of 52 feet, 11 inches, and the discus with a throw of 141-0. Dante Deshautelle won the high jump (5-1), Cade Sommers captured the pole vault title (15-0), Ylian Ostojic won the 400 in 48.43 seconds, and Jai Bell won the 110 hurdles in 15.66. Bryce Barry, Ostojic, MJ Byrd and Ifeoluwaleyi Orekoya led the Warriors to the 4x100 relay title in 42.14.

For the Thousand Oaks boys, Oliver Clippinger-Zimmer won the 3,200 (9:21.22), Powell Williams won the triple jump (42-9.50), Andrew Simon-Lacombe won the long jump (21-1.75), and Lucas Schneider won the 300 hurdles (40.69). The Lancers won the team title during the regular season.

For the Thousand Oaks girls, Madison Thai was a double champion, winning the high jump (5-2) and triple jump (34-3.25). Cassidy Kajita won the 3,200 title in 11:05.09 and Jordyn Brown won the long jump (16-8).

For the Newbury Park, Lily Cohen swept the throws, winning the shot put (32-4.50) and discus (113-8). Abigail Pace won the 300 hurdles (46.67) and Sophia Grant won the 1,600 (5:07.71).

The Calabasas girls had several champions, led by wins in both relay races. Lahela Ray, Paige Porter, Zoe Ray and Marley Scoggins took first in the 4x100 (46.11) and Lahela Ray, Arielle Mckenzie, Porter and Zoe Ray captured the 4x400 in 3:53.47. Scoggins won the 200 (24.48), Mckenzie won 800 (2:14.65) and Porter won the 400 (55.77).

Oaks Christian's Niya Clayton was a double winner, taking first in the 100-meter dash in 11.98 and winning the 100 hurdles in 15.09. The Lions won the girls team title during the regular season.

Claudia Turner of Westlake won the girls pole vault (12-0).

The Calabasas boys 4x400 relay team of Josh Smith, Kingston Celifie, Noah Johnson and Mentoa McKenzie set a league record with a time of 3:18.14. Celifie also sprinted to the 100 (10.86) and 200 (21.46) titles.

For the Newbury Park boys, Nathaniel Schohn won the 800 (1:55.31) and Arnav Shetty won the 1,600 (4:20.93).
