### PRESIDENT'S CORNER

During this festive holiday season, we are especially thankful for our residents who have donated to the ONA for membership dues and police patrols. APD recently began outsourcing patrols and rates have increased. Every dollar counts and we appreciate your continuing donations to support our safety and security priorities.

Oñate Elementary School recently reached out to our community for much needed assistance and involvement.

 Food Pantry. Behavior Redirector Sara Mcquarie, sara.mcquarie@aps.edu, shared information on Oñate's food pantry program for children experiencing food insecurities. While many schools provide free lunches, we continue to see families struggling with hunger. Sara estimates one in ten students at Oñate has food insecurities, one to two students per class. Each grade has two classes; grades K and 2nd have three each. They fill backpacks on Fridays and restock the following week.

Oñate has placed a gray barrel with a large teal sign just inside the front gate where we can drop off perishables. Some suggestions: Boxes of cold cereals, peanut butter, spaghetti noodles and sauce, canned soups, canned vegetables, canned beans, canned fish, whole grain pasta, brown rice, small packages of food, and boxed macaroni and cheese. Drop off hours are 7:30 AM - 2:30 PM, at 12415 Brentwood Hills NE, Albuquerque NM 87112.

2. Coffee with the Principal. We are invited to meet Principal Allie Weeda on the first Friday of each month. First planned date is Dec. 1, 8:00-9:00 AM; we will need to sign in and provide photo identification. Principal Weeda is new to Oñate and wants to engage with the community so let's get to know her. These are good opportunities to learn more about the school's structure and curriculum, especially for those researching schools in the area. We already have several residents who volunteer at Oñate, and you might run into a neighbor!
