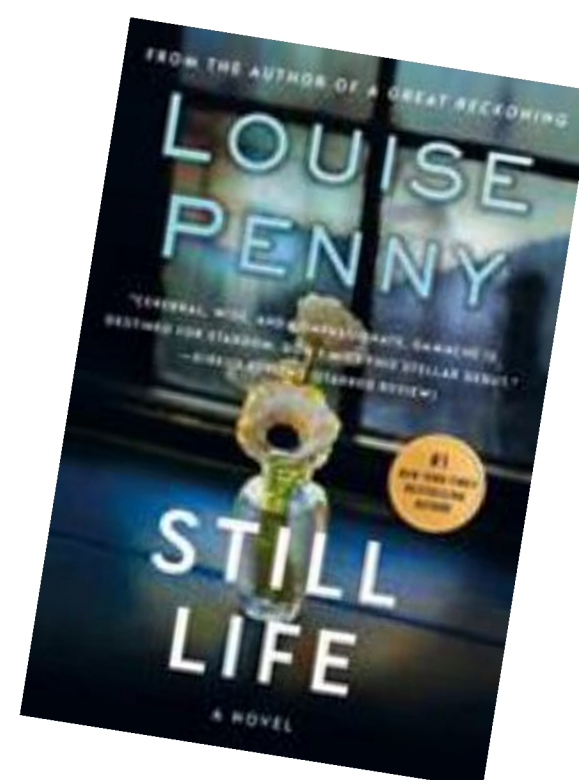
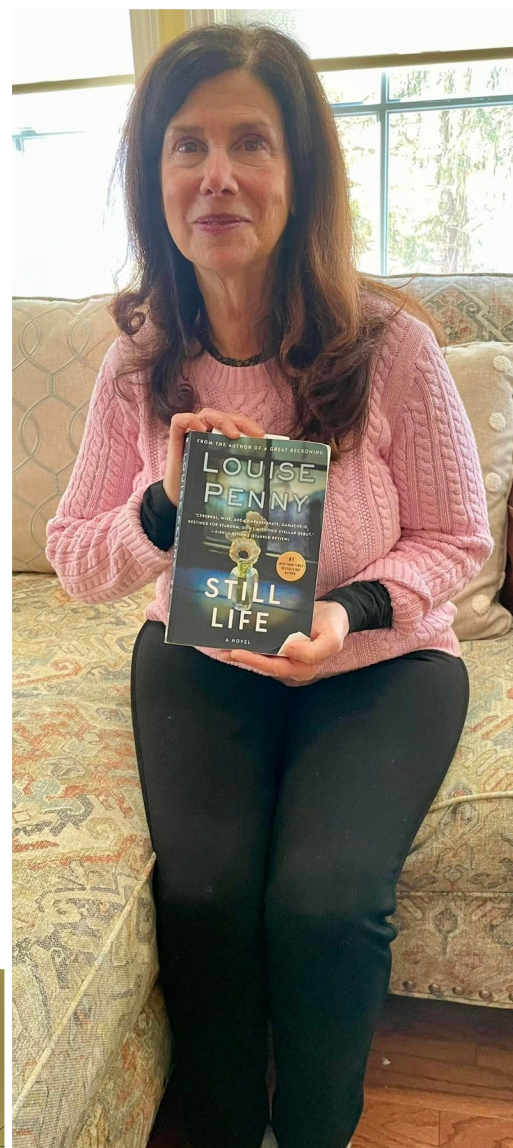


## Education & Libraries

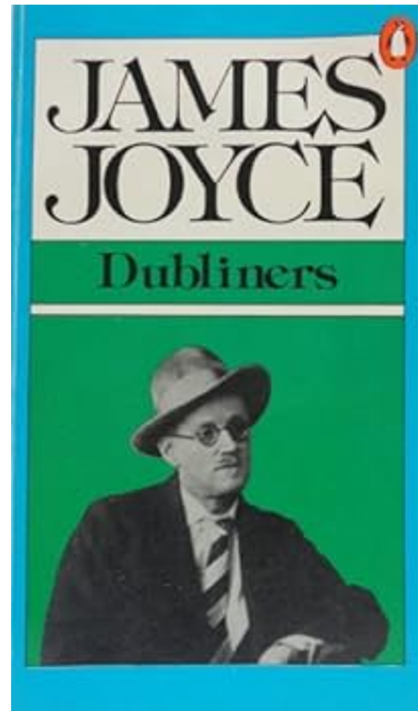
True to the French Canadian setting of "Still Life", our hostess, recreated the bistro with croissants, quiche, and more. Yummy!
