








John Salerno was pleased to accept our donations for the Shelter.

The Middlesex County Youth Shelter has served troubled adolescents and their families for 25 years. The facility moved to its present location in 1985 where it expanded to a 24-bed Juvenile/Family Crisis Shelter. The Shelter is operated by the Office of Adult Corrections & Youth Services.

The Shelter is a direct supervision, non-secure facility that houses male and female youths through referrals from the Family Court, the Family Crisis Intervention Unit and the New Jersey Division of Youth and Family Services. The role of the Shelter is to provide a safe, structured environment that allows the child to prepare for and accept placement plans including family reunification, group home placement, residential and foster care placement or substance abuse treatment.
