Masks and social distancing will be be required to take exams and for VE's.

Saturday morning January 23rd will be our yard sale/Swapmeet. It typically begins before the sun comes up with folks shopping using flashlights. We ask that you don't bring weapons or adult materials to sell. If you were planning on buying our selling at the Yuma Hamfest or other fests that have been canceled, this is an excellent place for you to do that.

The Big Tent RV Show will be open as will be a multitude of vendor booths. They're taking all precautions to prevent the spread of covid. Masks will be required to enter and remain in the Big Tent.

Our morning simplex net on 146.55 will be held each morning at 8am starting Sunday January 17th. On this net I'll be able to pass along any pertinent information for the group. I'll also ask for net members to announce activities that they're doing where others can join in, in a socially distanced manner of course course.
