Parish Picnic - Save the date August 30, 2026 at the Parish Hall from 1-5 pm.

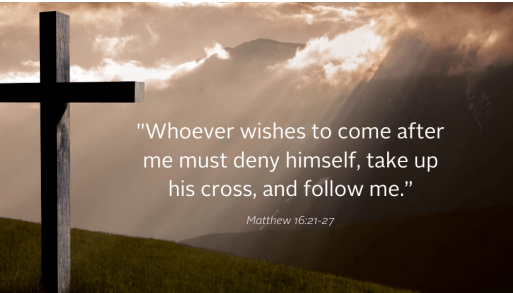

Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows Mass on September 15 at 5pm. Protect Virginia 2026 - This fall, Virginians will vote on the Virginia Right to Reproductive Freedom Amendment (Ballot Question 1). If this extreme amendment passes, it will enshrine virtually unlimited and unregulated abortion – at any time during pregnancy – in the state constitution. In his recent pastoral letter, Bishop Knestout calls upon the people of the diocese to vote “No” on this amendment: “Let us renew our commitment to support women in crisis, to protect the innocent, and to defend the vulnerable. We must choose life.” As early voting begins on Friday, Sept. 18, please take time to review the resources and information found at ProtectVirginia2026.org.
