## SHOW REGULATIONS

## It is important that you read the following

1. All entries to be made on the appropriate form. Joint entries are not permitted.
2. Entry forms to be handed to: Annie Morris, 2a Cross Lane, Eastern in Gordano by 12 noon on Thursday 3rd April
3. An Exhibitor may place a maximum of 2 entries in any one class
4. All Horticultural exhibits to have been under exhibitor's own cultivation or in the possession of the exhibitor for at least TWO MONTHS
5. Exhibits to be staged, with class card, on date of show between 9.00am. and 10am
N.B. Pot measurements are taken from inside the rim.

All exhibitors must vacate the hall immediately after their staging is complete
6. The Judge's decision will be final
7. Any protest must be made to the show Secretary before 2.30 pm .
8. No exhibits to be moved before 4 pm . Any not removed by 4.30 pm will be disposed of by the Committee
9. The Committee, whilst taking every care with Exhibitors property, can accept no responsibility for any loss or damage.

They reserve the right to move any exhibit to assist in the display

## SHOW REGULATIONS - Continued

9 In the event of a tie for most points, the competitor with the most first prizes shall be deemed the winner

10 The placing of entries shall be regarded as acceptance of the above mentioned regulations

11 In all Horticultural classes judges will recognise correctness of naming as telling in favour of an exhibitor in a close competition

12 Competitors who won the Banksian Medal in 2021 or 2022 will not be eligible to win the medal at this present show

13 The New Members Cup will be awarded to the first time exhibitor who has the most points.

## Class

## Section 1 CUT FLOWERS

1. Vase of a good variety of garden flowers, some foliage, tidily presented but not as an 'arrangement'
2. Vase of annual Sweet Peas - mixed colours - any variety - 7 stems.
3. Vase of dahlias - 5 stems of one type - any variety.
4. Vase of 3 Roses - large flowered (formerly hybrid tea)
5. Vase of one stem of a Rose of any type.

6 .Display of 3 Gladioli spikes
7. Gladiolus - 1 spike

8 .Pansies or Violas in a bowl less than 200 mm ( $8^{\prime \prime}$ ) diameter
9. Vase of one variety of any flower not mentioned above, 380 mm ( $15^{\prime \prime}$ ) diameter maximum. 10 Miniature arrangement of flowers (inc. foliage as required) less than 100 mm (4") overall

## Section 2 FUCHSIAS

11 Fuchsia in pot greater than 180mm ( $7^{\prime \prime}$ ) in diameter
12 Fuchsia in pot 180 mm ( $7^{\prime \prime}$ ) in diameter or less
13 Fuchsia(s) in hanging basket $380 \mathrm{~mm}\left(15^{\prime \prime}\right)$ diameter or less

## Section 3 POT PLANTS

14 Pelargonium (Geranium) in a pot 180mm ( $7^{\prime \prime}$ ) diameter
15 Flowering Plant in a pot greater than 180 mm ( 7 ") diameter
16 Flowering Plant in a pot $180 \mathrm{~mm}\left(7^{\prime \prime}\right)$ diameter or less
17 Foliage Plant in a pot greater than180mm (7") diameter
18 Foliage Plant in a pot 180 mm ( $7^{\prime \prime}$ ) diameter or less
19 One or more Cacti or succulents in any size pot
20 Plants in a Patio container 460 mm ( 18 ") diameter or less
21 One Orchid, any variety, in see through pot 180 mm (7") diameter or less

22 Mixed Flowers and Foliage in basket 380 mm (15") diameter or less 23 Mixed Flowers and Foliage in basket 300 mm (12") diameter or less 24 One variety of Flower or Foliage Plant in basket $380 \mathrm{~mm}\left(15^{\prime \prime}\right)$ diameter or less

## Section 5 ROOT VEGETABLES

25 Potatoes - 5 -one named variety
26 Potatoes - 5 - one named coloured variety
27 Beetroot - 3 - with foliage trimmed and tied to $76 \mathrm{~mm}\left(3^{\prime \prime}\right)$
28 Carrots -3 - with foliage trimmed and tied to $76 \mathrm{~mm}\left(3^{\prime \prime}\right)$

## Section 6 OTHER VEGETABLES

29 Beans, French - 6 pods
30 Beans, Runner - 6 pods
31 Longest runner Bean
32 Onions from sets -3 with tied stems
33 Cucumbers - Pair of
34 Peas, Mangetout or snap - 9 pods of 1 variety in a single layer
35 Courgettes - 2 between 100-200 mm (4-8") in length
36 Tomatoes, 5 (with calyx) more than $35 \mathrm{~mm}\left(13 / 8^{\prime \prime}\right)$ diameter
37 Tomatoes, small fruited or cherry (with calyx) less than $35 \mathrm{~mm}\left(13 / 8^{\prime \prime}\right)$ dia.
38 Any other Vegetable
39 Collection of up to 12 mixed cultivated herbs in Vase 150 mm ( $6^{\prime \prime}$ ) or less

## Section 7 VEGETABLE COLLECTION

40 Collection of 4 vegetables ( 6 of each item) in seed tray approx.. $360 \times 220 \mathrm{~mm}\left(14 \times 8.5^{\prime \prime}\right)$
41 Soft fruit of one kind, with stalks complete, displayed in one layer on plate 180 mm (7") diameter or less

42 Any other fruit displayed in one layer on plate $180 \mathrm{~mm}\left(7^{\prime \prime}\right)$ diameter or less
43 Collection of any 3 kinds of fruit in one layer on a plate $255 \mathrm{~mm}\left(10^{\prime \prime}\right)$ diameter or less
