SHOW REGULATIONS

It is important that you read the following:

1. All entries to be made on appropriate form. Joint entries are not permitted.
2. Entry forms to be handed to:
Annie Morris 2a Cross Lanes, Pill
by 12 noon on Thursday 30th July,
3. Whilst any exhibitor may place a maximum of 2 entries in any one class as he or she wishes, he or she will be limited to one money prize in such class, although full points will be awarded.
4. **All Horticultural exhibits to have been under exhibitor's own cultivation or in the possession of the exhibitor for at least TWO MONTHS.**
5. Exhibits to be staged, with class card, on date of show between 9.00 am. and 10.00 am.
N.B. Pot measurements are taken from inside the rim.
All exhibitors must vacate the hall immediately after their staging has been completed.
6. The Judge's decision will be final.
7. Any protest must be made to the Show Secretary before 3.00 p.m.
8. No exhibits to be moved before 4.30 p.m. Any not removed by 5.00 p.m. will be disposed of by the Committee.

9. The Committee, whilst taking every care with Exhibitors' property, can accept no responsibility for any loss or damage. They reserve the right to move any exhibit to assist in display.
10. In the event of a tie for most points, the competitor with most first prizes shall be deemed the winner.
11. The placing of entries shall be regarded as acceptance of the above mentioned Regulations.
12. In all Horticultural classes judges will recognise correctness of naming as telling in favour of an exhibitor in a close competition.
13. Competitors who won the Banksian Medal in 2018 or 2019 will not be eligible to win the medal at this present Show.
14. New Members Cup will be awarded to the first time exhibitor who has the most points.

PILL AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB SHOW CLASSES

A maximum of two entries for any one class.

Section 1 - CUT FLOWERS

Class

1. Vase of a good variety of Garden flowers, some foliage, tidily presented, but not as an 'arrangement'
2. Vase of annual Sweet Peas - mixed colours - 7 stems
3. Vase of Dahlias – 5 stems of one type, any variety
4. Vase of 3 Roses – large-flowered (formerly Hybrid Tea)
5. Vase of 1 stem of a Rose of any type
6. Display of 3 Gladioli spikes
7. Gladiolus - 1 spike
8. Pansies or Violas in bowl less than 200 mm (8") diameter
9. Vase of one variety of Flower not mentioned above. 380mm (15") diameter max.
10. An arrangement in a cup and saucer

Section 2 - FUCHSIAS

11. Fuchsia in pot greater than 180mm (7") in diameter
12. Fuchsia in pot 180mm (7") in diameter or less
13. Fuchsia(s) in Hanging Basket 380mm (15") diameter or less

Section 3 - POT PLANTS

14. Seeds given by club to members in a 126mm(5") pot
15. Pelargonium (Geranium) in pot 180mm (7") diameter or less
16. Flowering Plant in pot greater than 180mm (7") diameter
17. Flowering Plant in pot 180mm (7") diameter or less
18. Foliage Plant in pot greater than 180mm (7") diameter
19. Foliage Plant in pot 180mm (7") diameter or less
20. One or more Cacti or Succulents in any size pot
21. Plants in Patio Container 460mm (18") diameter or less
22. One Orchid, any variety, in see through pot 180mm(7") diameter or less

Section 4 - HANGING BASKET

23. Mixed Flowers and Foliage in basket 380mm (15") diameter or less
24. Mixed Flowers and Foliage in basket 300mm (12") diameter or less
25. One variety of Flower or Foliage Plant in basket 380mm (15") diameter or less

Section 5 - ROOT VEGETABLES

26. Potatoes - 5 - one named white variety
27. Potatoes - 5 - one named coloured variety
28. Beetroot - 3- with foliage trimmed & tied to 76mm(3")
29. Carrots - 3 - with foliage trimmed & tied to 76mm(3")

Section 6 – OTHER VEGETABLES

30. Beans, French – 6 pods
31. Beans, Runner – 6 pods
32. Longest Runner Bean
33. Onions from sets - 3 with stems tied
34. Cucumbers – Pair of
35. Peas, Mangetout or Snap – 9 pods of one variety displayed in a single layer
36. Courgettes – 2 – between 100-200mm (4"-8") in length
37. Tomatoes, 5 (With calyx on) more than 35mm (1³/₈") diameter
38. Tomatoes, small-fruited or cherry – 5 (with calyx on) less than 35mm (1³/₈") diameter
39. Any other vegetable
40. Collection of up to 12 mixed cultivated Herbs. Vase to be 150mm (6") diameter. or less

Section 7 – VEGETABLE COLLECTION

41. Collection of 4 vegetables, (6 of each item) in seed tray approx. 360 x 220mm (14 x 8.5")

Section 8 - FRUIT

42. Soft fruit of one kind, with stalks complete, displayed in one layer on plate 180mm (7") diameter or less
43. Any other fruit – displayed in one layer on plate 180mm (7") diameter or less
44. Collection of any 3 kinds of fruit in one layer on plate 255mm (10")
