- 1. Opening: The meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm
- 2. Minutes: There was no change to the August 2, 2022 minutes. AS moved to approve the minutes from the August meeting. JW seconded. The Trustees unanimously approved the motion.
- 3. Guest Speaker Jonah Spivak, Town of Bennington
 - Tally from game camera on right-of-way for April- August
 -239 people, 7 bikes, 31 dogs, 1 hunter, lots of wildlife, 12 people "going toward the bushes"
 - A camera focused on the monument parking lot requires a state contractor, could be part of upcoming renovations, requires a letter of support from the trustees
 - Questions left to answer: number of police incidents on Monument Circle in the last 5 years, how do Old Bennington residents feel about the idea of a path, how to block the intersection with the right-of-way to Bank St, statistics on walking path crime (does making a path change crime?).
 - 250th anniversary coming up- assume big celebrations will happen at the Monument
- 4. Citizen Comments
 - JT is in support of the path
- 5. Fidium
 - Utility work was seeded with grass when weather conditions improved.
- 6. Reports of Commissioners and Officers
 - a. Road Commissioner: Fairview potholes patched, MSK completed the coring on Bank and Fairview. Fairview traffic count by BCRC completed- counts will determine if road can be changed to Class II

- Commissioner working toward selling old police cruiser
