- 1. Opening. The meeting was called to order at 7:05

- 5. Bank of Bennington Signing and Discussion
  - request for a controlling party that can sign off on things. can't be treasurer, has to be redone when the board changes (every year). paperwork not present signing next time.

  - need a plan because it's tied to FEMA money
  - VT emergency Management called to offer grant to cover part of the cost but still would cost \$3000
  - possibly committed to making one after Hurricane Irene, but no one is sure
  - suggestion to ask to join Bennington's plan (has been done in the past)

## 7. Reports of Commissioners.

- a. Road Commissioner.
  - emailed Mr Henderson (BCRC) about money for Bank Street. Grant due soon.
  - new road signs have been ordered
- b. Tree Commissioner.
  - Cemetery tree work wasn't completed, one of the trees dropped a big branch in the road, Jerome cleaned it up.

- Requesting payment from Bennington for cleanup, as per bylaws (tree owner pays for work)
- c. Parks and Sidewalks Commissioner.
  - Streetlights: some streetlight parts are made out of plastic (and from the wrong time period) plastic parts are deteriorating- reinforcing the plastic is suggested by Monument Electric for \$100-125 each (stop gap).
  - Is there a more long term solution?
  - An audit of all lamps would be about 250\$
  - EW makes a motion to authorize the audit (with photographs, try to find manufacturer) SA seconds. Motion passes.
- d. Police Commissioner.
  - Officer Corey: 52 hours, 10 tickets, \$1792 potential fines, 36 property watches
  - No update on camera (Bennington Chief working on grants)
  - Speed sign is stored for winter- could borrow it in non-plowing season
  - Proposed cameras in circle, increased Officer Andy presence at night
- e. Treasurer.
  - CDs need renewing. It doesn't really matter- interest is very low.
  - Police auto repair \$558.24
