1. Any citizen of the State of Florida is eligible to exhibit arts and crafts in the Florida Agriculture and Wildlife expo hereafter referred to as FAWE.
2. Exhibits must be the original work of the exhibitor.
3. A maximum of three entries per class, per entrant, unless otherwise stated will be accepted for judging
4. All exhibits must be passed by the entry committee. The entry committee is the final authority in disqualifying entries not conforming to the rules.
5. Judging will be completed by qualified individuals. Each exhibit is judged on its own merit. Ribbons in each class will be awarded: blue, red, white, and green, Best of class, and Best of show will be awarded.
6. No exhibit or award may be removed before noon Sunday, March 22, 2026. Exhibit pick-up will be Sunday, March 22, 2026 from noon to 2pm.
7. We will not be accountable for exhibits left after 2:00p.m., March 22, 2026.
8. All care will be taken to safeguard exhibits. All properties should be marked with name of exhibitor. FAWE will not assume liability for damage or loss.
