- Young Professionals Marketing: We have attended numerous virtual gatherings at local colleges and universities - usually very highly attended. Topics discussed are what ASIS International is, benefits of membership, local chapter membership and involvement, and cost for both (\$20 a year for ASIS International is a great ROI).
- Information Sharing, Retention, and Succession: We activated and are gradually
 migrating to a Google Drive methodology for storing Chapter Activities (BOD Minutes,
 Treasurer Reports, etc.) to assist with ease of information access by all, document
 retention consistency and ease of succession.
- <u>GSX2021</u>: We have been meeting, mostly virtually, regularly with ASIS International to provide input and feedback, and ensure we are taking the necessary steps to support the GSX2021 Event to be held at the Orange County Convention Center in Orlando Florida on September 27, 28 and 29 of 2021.
- Looking Forward:
 - Begin holding "in-person" Chapter Lunch & Learn Meetings in July 2021.
 - Support GSX, once local chapter volunteers are solidified, will most likely be reaching out to other Florida Chapters to ensure needs of ASIS International are met
 - Putting final touches on a Security Officer Recognition Program which would allow company or organization leaders to nominate Security Officers for recognition by ASIS Orlando. We would then go to the location and personally award the recipient - to include a certificate and chapter challenge coin.
 - We need to continue to stay on top of our website (to ensure information is both correct and timely/current) as this is the way most get our information in addition to our monthly email communications.
 - We plan on continuing the tradition of holding a chapter social/team building event in November and holiday social event in December (attendees at our holiday event bring unwrapped toys to benefit the Salvation Army Toy Drive.
