Protective Measures Course (PER-336)

Event Purpose

The Protective Measures Course (PMC) provides participants with a basic understanding of how to identify risks and vulnerabilities to a facility, determine additional security needs for a special event/public gathering, and identify and apply physical and procedural protective measures to mitigate the threat of an improvised explosive device (IED) or vehicle-borne IED.

Who Should Attend?

This course is designed for public and private sector security personnel at the executive, management, and operations level. Public safety workers, emergency managers, law enforcement, and special event security personnel can also benefit from the course.

Protective Measures (PER-336)

The **Protective Measures** course provides participants the foundational knowledge to identify risks and vulnerabilities to a facility, venue, or event and identify various types of protective measures to mitigate an IED threat. Participants apply concepts introduced throughout the course with hands-on activities.



Course Format and Audience

This is a one-day, in-person instructor-led training covering the following topics:

- Overview of explosive effects
- Identifying risk
- Protective measures
- Determining the appropriate protective measures
- Special event and public gathering security

This course is designed for groups of up to 25 participants and is intended for audiences such as:

- Critical infrastructure owners and operators
- Public safety officers
- Emergency managers
- Security officers
- Law enforcement officers
- Private sector security professionals
