It is the mission of the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection's Reclamation of Abandoned and Dilapidated Properties Program to assist county commissions and municipalities in their efforts to remediate abandoned and dilapidated structures as set forth in §22-15A-30 of the A. James Manchin Rehabilitation Environmental Action Plan (REAP).

2021 REGULAR SESSION Senate Bill 368

BY SENATORS SWOPE, STOLLINGS, PLYMALE, PHILLIPS, WOELFEL, SMITH, BALDWIN, AND JEFFRIES [Passed April 10, 2021; to take effect July 1, 2021]

- A. **To assist county commissions or municipalities** in their efforts to remediate abandoned and dilapidated structures.
- B. There is created in the State Treasury a **special revenue** fund known as the Reclamation of Abandoned and Dilapidated Properties Program Fund.
- C. The fund may be used **solely to assist county commissions or municipalities in remediating abandoned and dilapidated structures** in their communities by demolishing or deconstructing them...
- D. The **Department of Environmental Protection** may:
 - a. promulgate rules to govern the disbursement of money from the fund
 - b. establish the Reclamation of Abandoned and Dilapidated Properties Program
 - c. direct the distribution of money from the fund, and establish criteria for eligibility to receive money from the fund.



Initial Steps of WVDEP's new program

- 1) Research and Outreach
 - a) Developed County and Municipality contact list.
 - Reviewed educational information and reached out to WV Bad Building Program, WVU Law Clinic, WV Land Stewardship Corporation and others.
- 2) Emailed a survey to >200 Municipalities and Counties
- 3) Out of 81 Respondents, 19 Municipalities and 9 Counties reported that they had a dilapidated structure program.
- 4) A more detailed follow up questionnaire was developed to identify which of the top candidates should be eligible for the program's first round of funding.
- 5) From the follow-up questionnaire, 21 candidates were recommended for funding eligibility.





Pilot Grant Recipient Statistics

 21 candidates were recommended for \$10 Million in federal ARPA funds allocated by WV Governor Jim Justice

- 18 municipalities and 3 counties
- 18 out of 21 candidates are located within a Justice 40 disadvantaged community
- 12 out of 21 candidates will have 100% of their identified properties demolished
- A total of 221 commercial structures were identified
- A total of 2,579 residential structures were identified
- \$9.3 million is being recommended for allocation
- \$27.3 million would be needed to fully fund demolition for all of the structures identified by the candidates being recommended.
