DISCUSSION QUESTIONS



- At the start of the novel, Maggie makes the bold choice to "sign off" and disconnect. What did you think of that decision? Have you ever felt the need to do the same?
- Cottage country plays a major role in setting the tone of the story. How did the setting influence the characters' choices, moods, and relationships?
- Let's talk about the romance. What drew Maggie and Thomas together, and what challenges did they face in allowing themselves to fall in love? Did you root for them from the start?
- Friendship and community are strong threads in the book. Which supporting character stood out to you most, and why?
- Maggie's journey centers on rediscovering her voice after walking away from broadcasting. In what ways does she reclaim her voice over the summer—and what does "having a voice" mean to you in your own life?
- Food, music, and shared experiences play a big role in the story. Which scene felt the most vivid or nostalgic to you?
- What do you think the characters will take with them from this summer into the next chapter of their lives?
- If this story were adapted into a movie or series, who would you cast in the lead roles? What songs would absolutely need to be on the soundtrack?
- What did Signing Off for the Summer leave you thinking about? Were there any personal takeaways or moments that stayed with you after you finished the book?

Music has always been part of my storytelling. I grew up performing in musical theater, belting out dramatic ballads, and dancing in ensemble numbers. It felt natural to pay tribute to that influence in this novel and if you look closely you'll notice a few quiet nods to those timeless songs throughout the pages.

Alongside that theatrical spirit, this playlist is filled with the kind of music that captures the ache and beauty of summer. Indie folk artists like New West and Hollow Coves bring a grounded intimate feel perfect for quiet moments on the dock or a slow walk through the woods. And then there are the songs that speak to the heart's deeper longings. The kind of yearning that only summer romance seems to awaken. Think Lana Del Rey (dreamlike, moody, and full of nostalgia and emotion!)

This playlist is a reflection of all those layers A little bit dramatic, a little bit wistful, and deeply rooted in the atmosphere of cottage country. I hope it sets the mood for your book club gathering or your next drive with the windows down.
