Over 20,000 Americans gathered outside the United Nations on Friday September 27th, 2019 to show solidarity and highlighted the human rights violations being committed in Kashmir. This was a historic protest which included numerous religious, community and human rights organizations all united raised signs and slogans in support of Free Kashmir.

The Kashmiri people have been completed isolated from the world and living with no health care, education and food. A report by the Office of the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights raised serious concerns about abuses by security forces in Kashmir. Those included the use of excessive force to respond to protests and the detention of protesters, political dissidents, and other activists on vague grounds for long periods, ignoring regular criminal justice safeguards.


APAG focuses on issues that affects the Pakistani American community and is led by Ali Rashid and a great group of community activists and leaders.

American Pakistan Advocacy Group is proud to rally along with Our City Our Vote bill coalition to support the right to vote for immigrants in NYC.

This legislation would amend the City Charter to permit lawfully present residents and those with work authorizations to vote in municipal elections, such as races for mayor, comptroller, public advocate, borough president, and city council, as well as referenda and other local contests. The legislation would also allow residents to join political parties, and vote in primary elections for municipal offices. Under its terms, a noncitizen would be qualified to vote in municipal elections if she or he is (1) a lawfully permanent resident or authorized to work in the United States; (2) a resident of New York City for at least 30 days; and (3) otherwise qualified to register to vote under New York State election law once exempted from the requirement that she or he possess United States citizenship.
