Services we can offer:

Carers' Assessments

We will meet with you so you can tell us what impact caring has had on you and your life.

We will discuss what there may be available to make your caring role easier and develop a support plan to meet any eligible needs you may have.

We provide this service on behalf of Kent County Council

Kent Carers Emergency Card

This will enable immediate access to pre-arranged planned care for the person you support if you are taken ill or involved in an accident.

The service is free and available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Training

Training courses to support you in your caring role

Training for professionals and talks to community groups about Carers' issues

Carers Voice

Involve Carers Forum - An opportunity for Carers to speak directly to planners and managers of health and social services, influencing the work of statutory agencies
