

## Guidelines for Bridge Players

When playing at Temple Beth Torah, it is important for everyone to remember bridge players are guests and need to be respectful of and honor the Temple's Policies.

1. Please drive slowly as you enter and exit the parking lot from either entrance.
2. When dropping off players at the front door, please pull over to the right to allow other vehicles to pass by.
3. Unless you have a "Handicapped" placard, please park in the back half of the parking lot. Please do not park in the Rabbi's, President's, or Educator's parking spots that are so indicated by signage.
4. Remember, the Temple operates a nursery school. Watch out for young children being dropped off or picked up. And please don't park in the parking area near the preschool.
5. Always enter and exit the Temple through the front door only.
6. Please keep the front door closed at all times. Do not ever place a rock, book, backpack, etcetera, to prop open the door if you have forgotten something. The front door must be secured at all times!
7. The lobby is not for bridge players. Please socialize in the bridge playing area only.
8. Please do not use any chairs from the lobby or from the library. They are not ours.
9. Please do not play the piano!
10. The outside patio area is not available for us to use. We can, however, use the outdoor atrium located behind the director's table.
11. If you bring a snack or sandwich, make sure it doesn't contain pork or shellfish out of respect for Jewish dietary laws.
12. To keep everyone safe, please do not bring a weapon of any kind into Temple Beth Torah.
13. Please use respectful language and courteous behavior when interacting with the Temple staff, directors, and all bridge players.
14. Remember, children may walk through the bridge playing area at any time. Please do not wear any clothing, hats or jewelry that could be offensive.
15. If you need to make a personal phone call, please turn off the speaker on your phone and make the call in the atrium. Please do not talk on the phone near the temple offices.
