

The invasive insect, hemlock woolly adelgid, is one of the most serious threats faced by hemlocks in Maine. Although it has not yet been found in Orland, it is nearby. What do you need to know about this insect, and what is the state doing about it? Maine Forest Service entomologist, Colleen Teerling will talk about what you can do to help protect your lake.

Sad to report the death of one loon, found before the count. Wildlife resources has a backlog, so it will be a while before we hear the cause of death, but they suspect lead poisoning. Another dead loon on Green Lake was suspected fireworks trauma.
