Visitors come from all over the Midwest. But Spring Green is a day-trippers' destination all on its own for anyone coming from north central and southern Wisconsin, southeastern Minnesota, northeastern Iowa, and northwestern Illinois.

The area boasts of rich views of the Wisconsin River valley and four of its bordering small towns of Arena, Lone Rock, Plain and Spring Green in the three counties of Iowa, Sauk, and Richland.

Just 45 minutes from Madison, three hours from Milwaukee, four hours from Chicago and six hours from Minneapolis, Spring Green holds the secret to a unforgettable getaway weekend.

It's the home of such world-renowned attractions like American Players Theatre, the House on the Rock and where the architectural legacy of Frank Lloyd Wright lives on at Taliesin. Visitors find many other hidden gems in the art galleries, cheese factories, local restaurants and quaint, unique shops.

The Wisconsin River and Wisconsin River valley are major draws for paddlers, anglers, hunters, artists, photographers, eagle watchers, birders, hikers and is a nature lovers' paradise.




This year marks the 22nd annual Bob Fest (as in Bob Dylan) on Memorial Day weekend (Sunday, May 26), and the 11th annual Beatle Fest Labor Day weekend, (Monday, September 2) in the back yard of the Spring Green General Store. At both events audiences hear virtually every genre of music as area musicians "come together" to interpret Bob Dylan and Beatle songs.

The popular music venue the Shitty Barn, marks its tenth year in 2019, and yes, you read that correctly. It's a fun atmosphere in a renovated old barn that offers an eclectic line up of bands, solo musicians and duos.

Taliesin is the home, studio, school, and 800-acre agricultural estate of Frank Lloyd Wright, located near Spring Green, WI. With buildings from nearly every decade of Wright's life from the 1890s to the 1950s, Taliesin is one of the most significant architectural anthologies in the world and is nominated to become a UNESCO World Heritage site.

Taliesin is the heart of a series of building that Wright designed for himself and his family members on the estate. Other buildings include: Romeo & Juliet Windmill (1896), Tan-y-Deri (1907), Hillside Theater & Drafting Studio (1932), Midway Barn (1920), and the Frank Lloyd Wright Visitor Center (1953).

The concept of Taliesin dates back to the 1800s when Wright's ancestors emigrated from Wales to this location, in search of a better life. Through progressive education and transformative ideas, Taliesin became a source of inspiration for how Frank Lloyd Wright sat the world; a world where nature, art, community, and work are integrated to nurture each individual's growth.

Taliesin Preservation aims not only to educate about Wright's legacy, but Taliesin's legacy, in its entirety. Wright was a farmer, architect, graphic designer, landscape architect, writer, musician,

art collector, and educator. We strive to preserve Taliesin's natural, cultural, and built environments but create a place for others to apply the same spirit of innovation and give guests the opportunity to have a more beautiful life.

For a truly immersive experience for guests to experience and explore, Taliesin hosts farm dinners, chamber music concerts, lectures, art workshops, and so much more. Taliesin continues to be a laboratory for individuals to come together for thought exchange, experimenting with materials and space, and addressing the human needs of our time. With a "hands-on, minds-on" philosophy of living through experience, exploration, and expression is crucial to an individual's own learning and growth.

The House on the Rock began in 1945 when a man named Alex Jordan had a towering goal: to build a retreat as awe-inspiring as the view from the rock upon which the House would eventually be built.

What took shape on and around Deer Shelter Rock is a truly remarkable achievement. The House was only the beginning. In the years that followed, Alex expanded his vision beyond the house and collected and built on a massive scale. In the end, he had created the world-renowned attraction known as The House on the Rock.

One Man's Dream

Geologists say a huge ocean once covered this lush green valley. The waters eroded the stone and left craggy rock formations towering the valley floor. Alex first spied one such unusual outcropping of rock called Deer Shelter Rock, which by then had become a popular picnic spot, on a family outing when he was a boy, and by the early 1940s he was already dreaming of building a house there.

And so began his life-long endeavor. At first he built what he called a "shack" but tore it down because he was not satisfied. He then rebuilt and called his creation "The Winter Room" which he used as a private retreat where he could pursue his interests in music, books and sculpture. In the years that followed he added more rooms. Alex never drew up any plans for the House but built directly from the ideas in his head and was not afraid to tear down, backtrack and re-build if things were not to his liking.

Jordan's grand project began attracting attention from friends and passersby. As the number of sightseers increased, he built a staircase for them—now a 375-foot ramp through the treetops.

In 1960, he bowed to the inevitable and opened the House on the Rock to the public, charging fifty cents for admission. The revenue was immediately reinvested in expanding the scope of his dream. What started as a simple "shack," a sculptor's retreat, continues to charm and fascinate thousands of visitors from around the world.

Plan To Visit Soon

Since those early days, the world Alex Jordan created has grown far beyond the original House and into an attraction with many buildings, exhibits and collections. During the Regular Season, the attraction is divided into three sections. The Regular Season runs from March 14 to November 10, 2019. The Ultimate Experience Admission includes all three sections. If you are short on time, consider the Highlight Experience admission (Sections 1 and 2) or the Original House Experience (Section 1).


In Section One you'll visit the foundation of Alex Jordan's vision. Section One includes the Asian Garden, the Alex Jordan Center and Sculpture Pavilion, the Gate House and the Original House and the Infinity Room.

Section Two moves from the unique architecture of the House to the imaginative contents and creations of Jordan's vision. Section Two features the Mill House, Streets of Yesterday, the Heritage of the Sea, the Tribute to Nostalgia, Music of Yesterday, Spirit of Aviation and the Carousel.

Section Three's focus is on Alex Jordan's varied and eclectic collections that range from the miniature to the magnificent. Section Three includes the Carousel, the Organ Room, Inspiration Point, The Doll House Room, the Circus Room, the Galleries, the Doll Carousel Room and the Japanese Garden.

During the holidays, The House on the Rock is transformed with the splendor and joy of the Christmas season. Santa takes up residence in a big way! As you stroll through the shortened tour of exhibits, you'll be greeted by more than 6,000 collectible Santas of all sizes and types – large, small, fancy and homespun. Sections 1 and 2 are open and Section 3 is closed during Christmas at The House on the Rock. The Christmas experience runs from November 14 to December 30, 2019.

Spring Green Arts and Crafts Fair grows for 50 years From 1969 to 2019 and counting.

was the year we watched as the first humans walked on the moon. A three-day rock concert attended by 40,000 young people known as Woodstock made headlines. The war in Vietnam raged on. Charles Manson terrified us while the Fifth Dimension allowed us to "let the sun shine in" and the Credence Clearwater Revival band told us about Willy and the Poor Boys playing "down on the corner and out in the street."

Amidst that tumultuous and historic summer in American history, there was a small group of local artists in Spring Green who would begin to set up their work down on the corner and out in the street.

Fifty years ago this year, area art lovers and artists came together to organize a small festival where artists set up displays on the main drag of Spring Green to highlight and sell their pieces.

"We make a big effort to promote the fair," Hess said. "Artists know there'll be a good crowd. We know there's been booths that generate \$10-15,000 over a weekend. There could be over \$500,000 in sales, but we haven't tracked that in the last ten years. There is significant impact to the artists."

He said for the 2019 fair, 220 artists were selected in ten categories. Those categories include glass, photography,

sculpture, graphics, fiber, jewelry, painting, wood, pottery and a category of fine crafts.

The Spring Green Arts and Crafts Fair has grown exponentially in its roster of artists and typically draws a minimum of 10,000 people seeking that one-of-a-kind piece that speaks to them. The fair has raised over \$1 million, donated back to the community in grants, scholarships, publicity and payments

to the service groups who provide food for the fair.

And they haven't stopped coming.

Christl lausly was one of those first artists on the street as the Arts and Crafts Fair was in its infancy. A German immigrant, lausly was a young mother in her early 30s who used pressed wildflowers to create scenes on her own hand-made paper. With small children, she didn't make the Arts and Crafts Fair every single year, but she was there the second year it was held.

"I had a lot of customers that came every year," lausly said. "When my children were old enough to help, I went back to it. Even lately it's been kind of a family affair because now I have five grandchildren.

In more recent years, artists who apply for entry into the fair are iuried and entries come close to 350-400.

John Hess volunteers as the fair's treasurer. He has also been helping to judge artists for entry since 1987.

The primary mission of the fair is to support the arts in the River Valley area. Each fall, grant proposals are submitted from non-profit organizations in the River Valley area to the art fair committee for arts-related projects that will impact a large number of people.

Grants totaling about \$300,000 have been given to some beloved community members including the Spring Green Community Library, Gard Theater, River Valley Players, Rural Musicians Forum, American Players Theatre, Bloomin' Buddies garden club, River Valley School District, Spring Green Area Chamber of Commerce, Taliesin Preservation, St. John's School, Spring Green parks, Wyoming Valley Cultural Arts Center and many others.

A scholarship was established in 1971 to help River Valley High School students pay tuition for college. To date, about \$30,000 has been distributed to those students.

CYCLING

There are many wonderful bike routes in the Spring Green area. A marked bike lane runs all the way from Hillside School Road (just south of the Wisconsin River on Hwy. 23) to Dodgeville, and the **Military Ridge Bike Trail** is also accessible from Spring Green by following Highway 23 south to County Highway Z.

The Pine River Bike Trail, between Lone Rock and Richland Center, is laid on an abandoned rail bed. The trail gives riders the opportunity to enjoy the beautiful river bluffs without riding over them. Parking and access is available in Lone Rock, Gotham and Richland Center. 

HIKING

From state parks to nature preserves, the Spring Green area offers hikes through the woods, prairies and wetlands where you'll witness all types of flora and fauna. The following are a few places to begin:

Avoca Prairie. For wildflower and native plant enthusiasts, and for those who like their recreation on the wild side, an outing to this 970-acre wet-mesic prairie is highly recommended. Located in the Avoca Unit of the Riverway, 7 miles west of the Lone Rock bridge on Highway 133, the Avoca Prairie is the largest tall grass prairie east of the Mississippi. It is probably the only place in the eastern U.S. where, no matter where you stand, you only see natural prairie-savanna features. We recommend that you check in with the ranger station at Tower Hill State Park before heading out to the prairie.

Ferry Bluff. Located off Highway 60, four miles southwest of Sauk City, Ferry Bluff has a spectacular and historical view of the river and surrounding topography. To the north and east you can see the Baraboo Hills, containing some of the oldest rock in North America. On a clear day you can spot the highest point in southern Wisconsin, Blue Mounds, thirteen miles to the south.

Ferry Bluff is a spring nesting site for Cooper's Hawks. Winter visits are not allowed, however good winter viewing of Ferry Bluff is possible from Conservation Road just northwest of Mazomanie.

Spring Green Preserve. Located off Jones Road, two miles from Spring Green, the Spring Green Preserve has been called the "Wisconsin Desert," with a variety of cacti, sand dunes and dry grasses. It is an area where forest meets bluff and bluff levels off into plains and dunes. The preserves' self-guided trail allows you to learn as you go. At the trail head, you will find a pamphlet containing information corresponding to each of a series of numbered markers along the trail.

Saint Anne's Chapel. Built a half century ago on top of the high, wooded hill west of the present day St. Luke's Church in Plain, is open at all times. A strenuous climb takes you past the 14 stations of the Way of the Cross leading from St. Luke's through the cemetery and winding up the hill to the chapel. A short distance down the hill from St. Anne's Chapel is a replica of the Lourdes Grotto. There are benches along the path to allow for breaks.



PARKS

Tower Hill State Park

5808 County Road C, Spring Green

Tower Hill is a complete natural recreation experience that also offers a fascinating glimpse of Wisconsin history. Hike to the top of the bluff where an old shot tower and smelter house have been reconstructed and an exhibit explains the shot-making operation. The park also has eleven campsites, hiking trails, picnic areas and a canoe landing.

Governor Dodge State Park

4175 Highway 23, Dodgeville

Located eight miles south of Spring Green, this park is one of Wisconsin's largest, with 5,270 scenic acres of hills, bluffs and deep valleys, plus two lakes and a waterfall. The park offers hiking, biking, skiing, snowmobile trails, horse trails, camping, picnic areas, swimming, boating and fishing. Hunting is available in-season with proper permits.

White Mound County Park

S7995 White Mounds Drive, Hillpoint

At 1,100 acres, White Mound is the largest park in Sauk County, and features 104-acre White Mound Lake. Facilities are available for camping, hiking, fishing, cross-country skiing, hunting, swimming, snowmobiling and horseback riding. The entrance fee is \$4.00 per day or \$20.00 per year.

Village of Spring Green Parks

South Park: Carpenter Lane

Features baseball diamonds, picnic shelter, playground and skateboard park.

North Park: Daley Street

Features a baseball diamond, tennis courts, playground, picnic shelters, and a public outdoor pool.

Spring Green Dog Park: Shifflet Road

OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES

The Lower Wisconsin River

Traveling on the Lower Wisconsin River near Spring Green is ideal for those who like to take in the sights at a leisurely pace. River currents range from three to five miles per hour upstream of Spring Green and only one to two miles per hour downstream. There are no rapids, falls or portages along the entire 92.3 miles. Two-thirds of river-users are on the 25-mile stretch between Prairie du Sac and Spring Green. There are numerous canoe landings in the River Valley area, including those at Tower Hill State Park, Peck's Landing, Lone Rock (just east of the Highway 130 bridge) and Arena (South Bank).

Fishing

Both the main channel and backwaters of the Wisconsin River offer great fishing. In the main channel you'll find walleye, auger, catfish, small mouth bass and northern pike, among others. In the sloughs and bayous, there are bluegill, bullhead, crappie and largemouth bass. There is also good fishing to be had on area streams and lakes. Be aware of regulations, including size limits and protected species. Fines are hefty. For more information, contact the Wisconsin DNR office at (608) 935-3368 or visit dnr.wi.gov.

Hunting

There are several public hunting grounds and private hunt clubs in the Spring Green area. In the autumn, many hunters travel to the area for deer hunting, but other game includes coyote, wild turkey, quail, pheasant, and more. For specific areas and hunting/trapping seasons, see the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources website at dnr.wi.gov

THE LOWER WISCONSIN RIVERWAY

The Wisconsin River slices the Driftless Area into two unequal parts and has wended its way for 370 miles from its source on the Wisconsin-Michigan border south/southwest to the outskirts of Spring Green. The river maintains a leisurely pace and a steady westward flow from its source to its confluence with the Mississippi River 60 miles further.

A few basic precautions will ensure that you have a safe and enjoyable experience along the Wisconsin River:

- Always swim with a buddy and keep in visual and voice contact.
- Don't swim at night.
- Swim at designated beaches, where available. Don't swim in unfamiliar places.
- Obey posted signs.
- Don't dive from bridges, high banks or into water of unknown depth.
- Avoid hazards such as overhanging branches.
- Always wade upstream of sandbars, and be sure that everyone knows the downstream margins: sandbars drop off suddenly on the downstream side.
- If you are swept into deep water, resist the urge to return to your entry point or to swim directly toward shore. Instead, angle for shore while staying with the current.
- Wear a lifesaving device when using an inner tube, air mattress or other floating device.
- All water craft must be equipped with Coast Guardapproved lifesaving device for each person aboard:

Glass containers of any kind are prohibited on the water. The current fine is a minimum of \$162.70 to a maximum of \$767.50 per container.



Friends of the Lower Wisconsin Riverway (FLOW)

Is a group that champions the 92 miles of pristine, free-flowing and legally protected—river between Prairie du Sac and the Mississippi River. These river enthusiasts help educate river users, advocate for continued protection of the riverway and the safety of users, and enjoy group recreational activities on the water and


In 2015, the Friends of the Lower Wisconsin Riverway (FLOW) partnered with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to place six "Kids Don't Float" loaner life vest stations on the Lower Wisconsin River, which, sadly, sees drownings each year, often of boaters who are not wearing life jackets. Members of the Friends group helped construct the architect-designed kiosks, and placed signs that list the other stations along the river where the life jackets can be returned after use. The newest kiosks bring the number of life jacket stations in the program to nearly 75, on lakes and rivers across the state.

Over the summer, the jackets were regularly borrowed and returned along the Wisconsin River. Life vest stations installed by FLOW are located at Peck's Landing and the Highway 14 landing in Spring Green and at the Town of Mazomanie, Arena, Otter Creek and Gotham boat landings.

River Valley Birders

Welcome to a great place for birding! With the Wisconsin River along its southern edge, the Spring Green area draws in a number



of species. Spring and fall migrations offer an astounding array of avian visitors, but many fascinating birds can be found throughout the year. The Town of Spring Green, which surrounds the village of the same name, has been a proud Bird City for four years, part of a statewide program that advocates

protection of bird habitat and education of citizens about our beautiful feathered neighbors.

Wisconsin is ideally situated at the northern edge of the Mississippi (River) Flyway, with lakes Superior and Michigan on its north and east coasts, respectively. With the Wisconsin River along its southern edge, the Spring Green area draws in a number of species, especially during migration. Each year, usually on the second Saturday of May, River Valley Birders, the local birding group, holds a bird festival, with a guided morning walk and speakers afterward. You can go the River Valley Birders Facebook page for information on the festival or other events.

On the north side of the village is the Nature Conservancy's Spring Green Preserve, referred to as "Wisconsin's Desert" because of its sand prairie features, including cacti, sand dunes and lizards. Here you will find grassland birds, including lark sparrows, dickcissels, meadowlarks and bobwhite quail. From the parking lot on Angelo Lane, a dirt access road off Jones Road, north of State Highway 14, you can hike across the prairie and to the top of the bluff, where spectacular views abound.

The Lower Wisconsin Riverway is itself a designated Important Bird Area, with hundreds of species having been identified in the backwaters and forested areas along the river. Take to the water in a kayak or canoe and you will spot bald eagle nests, herons and kingfishers. But there are also numerous trails traversing the state-owned land that hugs the river. 



Lone Rock

Welcome to Lone Rock. The coldest spot in the nation with the warmest hearts. It is located two miles from the Wisconsin River where there once was a large sandstone rock formation which boat traffic on the river used as a marker. Hence it got its name. The rock through the years has been used for basements, roads etc until it was not the huge marker that it once was. Settled in the 1850s, it was a thriving railroad town.

Lone Rock is a year 'round town with activities for all seasons including: hiking, bike trails, fishing, kayaking and canoes available for rent or sale, youth sports, snowmobile, and birdwatching. There is also a campground two miles from town, two convenience stores, three active churches, and lots of good food available. The Tri-County Airport is one mile from downtown and has a restaurant that is great for breakfast all day long. The Royal Bank serves the community, and there is a fine library for your reading pleasure or internet use. Don't miss the organic flour mill, where their products can be purchased. There are also several establishments where you can catch a cold one or quench your thirst.

Lone Rock has had a 4th of July Celebration for over 150 years. The day starts with a parade and ends with a fantastic fireworks display.

An important part of Lone Rock history includes the 6th Wisconsin Light Artillery Battery, a Civil War unit. The history of this Battery is preserved in the Dillon Tailor Shop in which the men of this unit were inducted. It was owned by Henry Dillon, who was voted to be their Captain by the inductees. Along with the Dillon Tailor Shop, a monument stands as memorial to the original recruits and the battles in which they fought. Jenkins Lloyd Jones, an uncle to Frank Lloyd Wright and the author of "Diary of An Artillery Man" served with this unit. William Cary Wright, Frank Lloyd Wright's father also lived in Lone Rock from 1860-1866 and was a musician, piano teacher and teacher.

Events held by the Historical Society include a Civil War Weekend held the second weekend in June. This year it will be a Living History encampment. This is followed in December by "The Festival of Trees." This starts off Friday evening with the Community Christmas Tree lighting followed by caroling and hot chocolate. Saturday there is a Chili luncheon at noon, viewing and judging of trees decorated by groups and individuals with a program, and events for all ages to follow. Many other activities throughout Saturday in Lone Rock include a cookie walk Saturday,


Lower Wisconsin River Road






