Origin	Introduced by John Adams, Norfolk UK 1826 (syn Norfolk pippin)
Tree	Partial tip bearer
Vigour	V2
Flowering group	3
Blossom and pollination	Self-fertile
Fruit Shape	Truncate conical shape. Medium-sized fruit
Skin & Flesh	Skin is partially russeted and the remainder of the skin is orange, yellow and red. The taste is quoted as being "crisp, juicy, rich and sugary with an agreeable and pleasantly perfumed flavour".
Harvest	Late
Storage	1-2 months
Uses	Eating - A popular Edwardian and Victorian dessert apple. Addition to cider. Cooking - baking.
