🐾 When Can My Puppy Go Out?

A Quick Guide to Walks, Socializing, and the Dog Park 🐶

Congratulations on your new puppy! Socialization and exercise are important—but timing matters to keep your puppy safe and healthy. Here's what you need to know:

Walks in Safe Areas

✓ Begin short walks in low-risk areas (your yard, driveway, or quiet sidewalks) after 2 rounds of vaccines—usually around 10–12 weeks, depending on your vet's advice.

✓ Avoid areas with heavy dog traffic until your pup is fully vaccinated.

Safe Socialization

✓ Early socialization is important!

Your pup can begin meeting calm, fully vaccinated dogs in a safe setting after their first or second round of vaccines, with vet approval.

Avoid any dogs who aren't current on vaccines.

Marks & Public Places

Wait until after final puppy vaccines (usually around 16 weeks) before visiting dog parks, grooming salons, pet stores, and other high-traffic areas.

These places can carry viruses like parvo, so wait until your vet says it's safe.

✓ Most puppies complete vaccines around 16 weeks

✓ Your pup is fully protected 1–2 weeks after the final vaccine

Quick Reminders

- Always check with your vet before visiting new places
- · Carry your puppy if you're unsure about the safety of an area
- Keep social and training experiences positive and fun!
