ike many of those who live in Camden County, longtime resident Kevin Van Horn says being near the ocean not only feeds his family, but also his soul.

"As a local fisherman for over 30 years, I've been fortunate enough to fish the coastal and offshore waters of southeast Georgia. We are blessed with some of the most fertile fishing grounds in the entire country," Van Horn says.

Some of his favorite times as a family have been spent boating and fishing under the hot Georgia sun.

"I'm proud and excited to introduce this resource to my 12-year-old son as well," he added. "Whether you are looking for some sea trout, red bass and flounder in close or mahi, king mackerel and sea bass offshore, coastal Camden has it all."

When he is not on the water, Van Horn is an active community volunteer and can often be seen working with the St. Marys Kiwanis Club on one of their many community projects.

One of Georgia's eight original counties, Camden is now home to a population of more than 54,000 people with 8,000-plus military and civilian employees at Kings Bay Naval Submarine Base and 613 square miles of pine and hardwood forest, rivers and marshes. The area's mild climate, scenic views, high-quality school system and small-town atmosphere despite its commercial growth make the county an exceptional place to raise a family.

Add that to the area's mild climate and scenic environment and it's easy to see why so many choose to call Camden County home. There is plenty to do in Camden — family activities, day trips and events are all in abundance here. Active drama, music and art groups engage audiences and participants in the arts and regional culture. The Guale Historical Society, the Bryan-Lang Archives and two regional libraries offer abundant research potential and programs about local history.

On the natural side, there's Crooked River State Park, with a nature center, hiking trails, a campground and riverfront cabins plus a bird blind for watchers and camera buffs. Numerous parks throughout the county offer places to fish, hike and picnic.

Guided trips with docents and interpreters bring history to the forefront at Cumberland Island National Seashore. The island is reached by ferry that travels between St. Marys' historic district and the island's south end. The island museum in St. Marys offers a preview to Cumberland's

300-year history.

The county also is a welcoming military community and home to Kings Bay. Retired Navy men and women help run the St. Marys Submarine Museum in downtown St. Marys. And the county's proximity to other Navy bases in Jacksonville, Florida, adds even more incentive for active duty and retired personnel who choose to make Camden County home.

Golf courses and golf communities offer challenging links. A county recreation complex with a heated pool and fitness center offers many classes, from water aerobics to spinning.

The local hospital, Southeast Georgia Health System, Camden Campus, provides treatment options close to home and a health care network that's affiliated with a larger hospital in Brunswick.

There are many shopping and dining venues throughout the county and plenty of opportunities to buy locally caught seafood, either fresh from the fishermen or in restaurants

All the comforts, stellar weather, outdoor life, plenty of elbow room and the friend-liness of a small, Southern community steeped in history make the county a destination for keeps. All that, and no traffic jams.



Medical services

There's nothing small town about your health care options in Camder

outheast Georgia Health System, which runs the medical center in St. Marys, has served the Golden Isles since 1888. Over the last decade, major renovations and expansions have brought a new level of comfort and medical care to Camden County.

"Our Camden Campus is unique among smaller community hospitals throughout the country," says Glenn Gann, vice president and administrator, Camden Campus. "A modern facility, it is supported with the latest diagnostic and treatment technology that is difficult to find in a hospital of this size.

"This is due to the ongoing strong support of the Camden Campus Advisory Committee and the health system's board of directors. With their support, we are able to provide many services to our community that you would not typically find in a hospital of this size. In addition, our medical staff and team members provide excellent and compassionate care to the patients we serve, something for which we are very proud."

Anchored by a 40-bed, acute care hospital, the Camden Campus provides a variety of services, including a 24-hour emergency care center, a medical-surgical unit with private rooms, an intensive care unit, a maternity care center with integrated rooms, orthopaedic and joint replacement surgery, a senior care center, an outpatient rehab center offering aquatic therapy and a brand new wound care center.

A radiology suite offers open MRIs, nuclear medicine capabilities and a PET/CT scanner, while a dedicated women's area handles mammography, ultrasound and bone densitometry.

The cancer care center provides patients with an array of diagnostic capabilities and treatment therapies.

"The health system offers cancer care centers on the Brunswick and Camden Campus, ensuring patients have access to



exceptional cancer care close to home," said Dr. Timothy A. Jamieson, radiation oncologist and medical director of the cancer care centers. "We have the resources, technology and specialists, including physicians representing all facets of oncology, for early disease detection and effective treatment."

The Camden hospital is located at 2000 Dan Proctor Drive in St. Marys. The not-for-profit health system includes multiple locations, such as a hospital on the Brunswick campus. To learn more, visit www. sghs.org.

The health system also has strategic affiliates in Camden County who provide a variety of care including general surgery, pediatrics, gastroenterology, hematology and oncology, primary care, pulmonary medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, radiation oncology and ear, nose and throat.

Camden also has a Veterans Affairs outpatient clinic that provides primary and mental health care. The clinic situated at 2603 Osborne Road, Suite E, in the Kings Bay Village Shopping Center in St. Marys. The phone number is (912) 510-3420. To learn more, visit www.northflorida.va.gov.

McKinney Medical Center, an income-based clinic, operates in Kingsland at 711 Charles Gilman Jr. Ave, Suite B. For more information and hours, visit www.mckinneymedicalcenter.com or call the clinic at (912) 510-9728.

There are also two nonprofit mental health clinics: Coastal Counseling Center and Camden Behavioral Wellness. Coastal Counseling Center serves adults, adolescents and couples and charges based on a sliding scale for uninsured clients and those with inadequate insurance. Group sessions are offered for anger resolution and substance abuse. Individual, family and marital counseling is also offered. 

small town charm people find endearing, yet we are posed for great economic growth and prosperity," Kingsland Mayor Grayson Day said.

From its location near Interstate 95, Kingsland is a hub for those looking to experience the coastal area's attractions, such as Cumberland National Seashore Island or an excursion through the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge.

"Kingsland is one of the most beautiful places to live along the Georgia coast," Day said. "We are geographically positioned along the I-95 corridor just inside the Georgia/Florida line. This makes us an advantageous location for new business and industry while still offering the benefits and comforts of a hometown feel. Kingsland is an amazing place to live and work."

Kingsland's air of Southern hospitality has grown in recent years as new businesses move into downtown and into buildings from the city's past.

"We really do have a community of nice people, and visitors feel that all the time. People get a sense of Southern hospitality," Kingsland tourism director Tonya Harvey said. "There's an abundance of that natural attraction here. It's also

what the visitors coming here are looking for. They're looking to relax, to get back in touch with nature and the outdoors."

Incorporated Kingsland's history can be found inside the restored train depot, located at the corner of East King Avenue and South Satilla Street.



The festival parade is one of the event's main attractions in addition to the fried catfish dinners. Booths line the streets selling an array of arts and crafts.

Other festivities include the annual Kingsland Lions Club Oyster Roast in late January, the annual Mardi Gras festival, a tree lighting ceremony in early December, the annual Martin Luther King Jr. Day march and a Veterans Day parade.

Downtown Kingsland features buildings from the 19th century, and its brick sidewalks lined with quaint streetlights justify its position on the National Register of Historic Places.

The city has a welcome center off Interstate 95 Exit 3 that serves thousands of visitors each year. The center houses information about the city and Camden County, attractions throughout the region as well as local art and produce, such as jams and honey. Experience the charm of a coastal community with a unique story to tell about America's history that spans centuries

t. Marys is a place some visitors just can't forget — and they find themselves becoming residents years later. St. Marys grabbed Joe Antao on his first visit. He wanted to retire in an affordable town by the ocean after living in the Dallas area for more than 30 years. His now wife suggested St. Marys, a place she had visited years ago.

"Initially, it was the downtown area," he said. "The beautiful Gilman park overlooking the St. Marys River, the historic Oak Grove Cemetery, the rustic look of an old-time fishing village and the maritime heritage of the town was a big draw."

Leslie Mary Wells and her late husband, Richard, took refuge in St. Marys about 30 years ago when a storm threatened their sailing trip. They ended up retiring in St. Marys.

"When Richard and I arrived, I told everyone up North that the people are so kind and polite," Wells said. "I actually said that I didn't know if I was nice enough to live in St. Marys. My husband,

in his inimitable humor, said, 'Leslie Mary, we know they are polite. We don't know if they are kind.' We soon discovered the kindness of the community exceeded their manners."

Joyce and David St. Clair visited St. Marys years before they moved here. Now, it's the place that "feels the most like home," according to Joyce St. Clair.

"We love the people in our neighborhood and our town," St. Clair said. "Everybody is so friendly. ... It's so nice to go to the grocery store and run into several neighbors. One reason that I'm in the grocery store a lot is that we're always having dinner with friends or one of our groups is having a potluck. It's just a friendly place to live."

Antao has found St. Marys to be a friendly place, too, with a true sense of community and a diverse geographical location. To the north, Jekyll Island, St. Simons Island and Savannah are within a two-hour drive. To the south, Fernandina Beach, Fla., Jacksonville, Fla., and St. Au-

gustine, Fla., are also within a two-hour drive and the Jacksonville International Airport is 30 minutes away.

"There is never a lack of things to do from summer concerts, beach time, festivals, parades, deep sea and intracoastal fishing, a ferry trip over to Cumberland Island and a visit to Crooked River State Park," Antao said. "Our children and grandkids love to visit."

Antao has also immersed himself in the community, participating in a visioning group, the nonpartisan Camden Roundtable, the Get Out the Vote Team, the cycling club, playing in the Camden Community Band and volunteering with MAP International in Brunswick.

"One of the very cool benefits of living in a small town is the closeness one feels with the community," Antao said. "It has inspired me to get involved and perhaps give back to the community."

In addition to a welcoming populace, St. Marys offers the charm of a small town enriched by a history dating back to the mid-1500s and proximity to rivers, marsh, the ocean and other natural wonders.

Part of St. Marys' history can be seen through Orange Hall. Situated on Osborne Street in downtown, Orange Hall



is a three-story Greek Revival mansion built in about 1838 that has been owned by the City of St. Marys since 1965.

Orange Hall has been the setting for weddings and club socials. The white house is also a focal point for the live nativity in December. For more information, call the St. Marys Welcome Center at (912) 882-4000.








Camden's smallest city offers a relaxed lifestyle, quick access to the outdoors

oodbine is such a quaint and quiet town that you might overlook what a prominent role it plays from the heart of Camden County.

As the county seat, accessible by both Interstate 95 and U.S. 17, it hosts the county's administrative offices, its courts and its jail. Yet it still maintains its laid-back and friendly appeal for those who enjoy a more rural atmosphere.

Residents and visitors alike bask in the serenity of life on the scenic southern banks of the beautiful Satilla. About 1,500 citizens enjoy the peaceful life of a rural small town, a low crime rate and remain on a first-name basis with most of their neighbors, local business owners and elected officials.

Woodbine is smallest of the three Camden municipalities and its city government works closely with a handful of citizens clubs and groups to hold special events in town. The five-member council is led by mayor Kizziler "Kizzi" Knight and city administrator Samantha Young leads the city staff.

As the county seat, the city houses government entities such as the Camden County Board of Commissioners, sheriff's office and the Camden County courthouse complex, but still maintains its charming atmosphere, appealing to residents and visitors alike.

Location is a major advantage for Wood-

bine. It is located at Exit 14 on Interstate 95, the city also sits at the crossroads of U.S. Highway 17 and Georgia Highway 110. It is situated for easy driving to the Kingsland-St. Marys area to the south, the Brunswick-Golden Isles area to the north and the Waycross-Blackshear area to the west.

The city is just 45 minutes from Jacksonville International Airport and has several shopping centers, beaches and entertainment venues just to the north and south of it.

Residents can wind down and recharge close to home without the bustle of a bigger city. Some families take a bike ride through town. Some people walk or run along the Riverwalk, others fish and boat along the Satilla River.

Various housing options are available for families who wish to make the city their home, including historic homes, existing homes within established neighborhoods as well as available building lots inside open and gated communities.

As home to the Bryan-Lang Archives, Woodbine serves as the keeper of the county's history. Genealogists and historians come to the city to research family trees or county history, admire the historic buildings or enjoy a quiet afternoon's reading.

The Old Woodbine School serves as the Camden Community Center. The community center offers cultural events, such as the Woodbine Opry. The opry features traditional bluegrass and gospel music being performed every Friday night and country music for dancing on Saturday night. Live musicians, singers and performers from Georgia, Florida, and other neighboring states, entertain audiences each week.

Nestled along the beautiful Satilla River, the flower-lined pathway of the Woodbine Riverwalk twists and turns as it meanders along the banks of the river beginning at the Satilla River Waterfront Park and ending at Liza Rudolph road to the south. The city, in partnership with the Path Foundation and Georgia Coast Rails to Trails Inc., has completed the final leg of the trail to the south, adding benches and a mountain bike course adjacent to the existing walkway south of West 11th Street.

The biggest community event is the Woodbine Crawfish Festival, one of the biggest festivals in the region. Usually held on the last Saturday of April and Friday prior, the annual festival, organized by the Woodbine Citizens Steering Committee, draws approximately 20,000 festival-goers for family-oriented entertainment and crawfish-centered cuisine.



he men and women of Kings Bay Naval Submarine Base in Camden County carry out a unique mission. Together, they keep the only ballistic missile submarines on the East Coast patrolling the coastline and deploying around the world to provide strategic deterrence.

"In the Atlantic, only here at Kings Bay do we have both ballistic missile and guided missile submarines, their only homeport on the East Coast. When I stop and consider the significance of this one-two punch, the SSGNs and SSBNs, what they are capable of, what they represent, and what is at stake, I'm awed by the strategic and global significance of little ole Kings Bay," former Sub Group 10 commander Rear Adm. Mike Holland said.

The six ballistic-missile submarines — plus two guided missile submarines — stationed at Kings Bay have made more than 4,000 strategic deterrence in the decades since the base opened.

"The world depends on us to do this," then-commander of U.S. Navy Submarine Forces Vice Adm. Michael Connor said upon the 4,000th patrol.

Supporting that mission are nearly 9,000 personnel — active-duty service members, Department of Defense employees and civilian contractors — with an annual payroll of \$500 million, making the Navy base the main economic engine of Camden County.

Trident Training Facility provides a state-

of-the-art school with instructional sections that can simulate a working submarine. Trident Refit Facility has been repairing and refitting submarines since 1985, keeping America's submarine force in top fighting condition.

Kings Bay and Camden County is also home to a Marine Corps security battalion and two Coast Guard units: the Maritime Force Protection Unit and the Maritime Safety and Security Team.


Those who work at Kings Bay do more than just clock in and out each day. They also perform regular acts of community service, such as cleaning roadways, and partner with the schools and neighborhoods, turning Camden County into their home away from home.

The community advocates for Kings Bay via the Camden County Chamber of Commerce's military affairs committee; The Camden Partnership, which promotes the base-community relationship; and the Camden-Kings Bay Council of the Navy League, which supports all sea services. There is also a local Submarine League, American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars chapters.

Many active-duty military personnel consider Kings Bay a favorite posting because of the approximately 16,000-acre base, the mild climate, affordable housing, abundant recreation on the area's waterways and in natural areas and the friendly reception in the community. Camden County also offers military personnel a rural place to live with close access to bigger cities.

Retired military personnel often choose to stay in Camden County and are operating businesses, taking leadership roles in civic and church affairs and volunteering in the community.

eople call Cumberland Island National Seashore a magical place. The largest of Georgia's barrier islands, Cumberland is an 18-mile-long wonder of maritime forest, tidal creeks, beach and saltwater marshes off the coast of Camden County.

Decades ago, Cumberland Island could have been lost to progress. It's wilderness turned into civilization with houses, more residents and a bridge to the mainland. But heirs of the Carnegies, who owned much of the island, started talking about a national park to thwart development and maintain the natural beauty.

"Cumberland has a mystique about it," said Lary Dilsaver, who wrote the park's administrative history. "It infected the Carnegies. It infected the park service people who have been there. Nobody ever forgets that."

Former U.S. Rep. Bill Stuckey, who played an integral role in creating the seashore, credits Cumberland's magic with its preservation.

"Preserving Cumberland is the simplest thing in the world," Stuckey said. "All one has to do is visit Cumberland, set foot on that island and that's all you have to do.

A national seashore packed with history and natural beauty

It's totally the most enchanting, mystical, beautiful (place) and it hasn't been spoiled."

This magic draws tens of thousands of visitors each year. Reached only by boat, the island became a national seashore in 1972 and the National Park Service owns much of the island, including Plum Orchard, a 22,000-square-foot house built by the Carnegies at the turn of the 20th century, and protects the land, wildlife and resources. Motorized traffic is limited to

park service personnel and a few resident who have retained rights.

How to see the island

The park service ferries visitors to the island twice a day from downtown St. Marys and offers guided and self-guided tours, including the Land and Legacies tour, which shows visitors the island's natural and cultural history with

stops at Stafford cemetery, Plum Orchard, the remnants of Cumberland Island wharf and the settlement.

The tour concludes at the settlement where former slaves purchased land, built houses and, in 1937, built the First African Baptist Church where John F. Kennedy Jr. married in 1996.

"It truly was the heart and soul of the African American community here on the island," said Maggie Tyler, former chief of interpretation and education for the island.



"Births, deaths, baptisms and everything in between occurred here at the church."

Visitors can also become immersed in the island experience by staying overnight in campgrounds from primitive to convenient with bathhouses and picnic tables by the beach.

A snapshot of history

Scientists, including anthropologists and archaeologists, and university students and instructors periodically come to Cumberland to study its first residents or the plants and animals. Early in 2013, a National Park Service archaeologist examined a shipwreck, likely from the 1800s, that had been found on the beach.

Among Cumberland's earliest inhabitants were the Mocama Indians—a subset of the Timucuas—that had several villages on the island and the mainland more than 4,000 years ago. In 1566, Spanish explorers arrived on Cumberland, setting

up a garrison and Catholic mission and seeking to convert the Indians to Christianity.

The late Camden County historian Rodney Sheffield said in 2009 that a lot of the island's history has yet to be told.

There were hundreds of Mocama Indians on the island when the mission was active, Sheffield said. Those Indians who became Catholics were allowed to be buried beneath the floor of the mission house as a place of honor, he said. There also would have been a friary and a large council house of the Indians in a compound with the mission.

Following the American Revolutionary War, grants of land to war heroes brought on the plantation era in the island and the importation of slaves to work the land. The Civil War ended the plantation era, and in the late 1800s and early 1900s, Thomas and Lucy Coleman Carnegie bought most of Cumberland as a winter playground and home for their family.









Crooked River State Park

Explore the natural wonders of southeast Georgia — both by land and water whether you're a visitor or a local

erched on the edge of a bluff along the Crooked River in St. Marys, the state park bearing the river's name offers scenic marsh views as well as endless activities for nature enthusiasts young and old.

Visitors to Crooked River State Park can fish off a floating dock, hike several nature trails, get a peek at native wildlife and try their hand at the park's miniature golf course.

Located about seven miles north of St. Marys off of Charlie Smith Sr. Highway, the park offers 500 acres shaded by palmetto and Spanish mossdraped oaks along salt marsh. Bike rentals, RV and tent sites for camping, rental cottages and picnic shelters are just some of the options for park visitors.

A boat ramp, guided kayak trips and nature programs are also available. Peak visitation months are September through May and daily park hours are 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.

Activities

The park features a nature center with animals, displays and special programs throughout the year. There is also a Junior Ranger program for children, a variety of ranger-guided nature walks that are designed for people of all ages, boat cruises, kayak trips, birding hikes, campfires, survival skills classes and scavenger hunts.

The popularity of weekend nocturnal wildlife walks has also been on the rise. Walks begin at dusk when wildlife is most active. Both children and adults are welcome to join this entertaining and educational experience.

Crooked River State Park also has themed events for seasons and holidays and a variety of day camps and events throughout the summer months, when most children are out of school.

In the fall, the park offers Creepy Crooked River in celebration of Halloween with haunted hayrides and haunted nature center tours.

Thanksgiving is a busy time for visitors at the park, and the staff hosts a variety of programs for all ages. In December and January, there are holiday-themed programs and the first day of the year hike. During the winter, Camden County school children enjoy educational field trips to the park.

Other annual events held at the park include the Audubon Society's annual backyard bird count in February. Those visiting the park by vehicle must pay a \$5 parking fee. Free parking passes can be checked out from local libraries. Annual parking passes are also available.

Early education

Camden County offers other early education options for children younger than kindergarten age. The county has a Head Start program in Woodbine.

Pre-kindergarten is available to 4-year-olds on a space-available basis that is determined by a lottery system. Each of the nine elementary schools in the system has one pre-kindergarten class. Students are required to register for the lottery at the elementary school for which they are districted. Pre-kindergarten classes also are available through local private day care centers.

New families are asked to register their children in the school system as soon as possible. Parents of a child receiving special education services from Schools' commitment to the a previous school should bring



a copy of a psychological evaluation, current individual education plan, current testing results other than psychological, current permission to place, placement minutes and permission to evaluate.





Camden's parks

Howard Gilman Memorial Park

Located on the waterfront in downtown St. Marys, this park offers a boat ramp and floating fishing dock, playground area, riverfront benches and swings and picnic tables, as well as one covered pavilion and a stage area.

St. Marys Recreation Authority Park and Pool

This park, located on Margaret Street in St. Marys, offers baseball fields, a football field with seating, playground, basketball court, a skateboard park and restrooms. There is also a pavilion with picnic area. Adjacent to the park is the St. Marys pool, which has a diving board, slide and kiddie pool with sanded area.

Tommy Casey Memorial Dog Park

Adjacent to the recreation authority park and pool in St. Marys, this fenced, off-leash dog park features plenty of trees for shade as well as open, sunny areas. There is stationary agility equipment for dogs, sturdy wooden benches for people and a faucet for filling water bowls or a quick rinse off. It is open daily from sunrise to sundown.

St. Marys Civic Park

This park is located on Herb Bauer Drive in St. Marys next to St. Marys Public Library. It has a pavilion with picnic tables and playground. St. Marys Civic Park also offers tennis courts, basketball courts, soccer fields, baseball, softball and T-ball fields and restroom facilities. It also is the site of the St. Marys Aquatic Center.

McIntosh Sugar Mill Park

This park is located off Charlie Smith Sr. Highway in St. Marys, just past the Stimson gate to Kings Bay Naval Submarine Base. The historic tabby ruins from an old sugar mill are located in this park, along with some shaded picnic tables.

Sweetwater Park

Located on Point Peter Road in St. Marys, this park offers tennis courts, a multi-use field, basketball courts, playground and restrooms.



Notter Pond

This little fishing pond is located on North River Causeway in St. Marys. It has shaded picnic tables and trash cans.

Howard Peeples Park

This popular destination is located on Gross Road in Kingsland and offers basketball courts, lighted tennis courts, softball fields, two playgrounds, covered picnic tables and restrooms. There is also a handicap-accessible playground.

Mary B. Smart Park

This park in Tarboro, on Camden's north end, offers a baseball field, basketball court, tennis court, playground, screened pavilion with full kitchen and restrooms.

Boat ramps

Meeting Street

Located on Meeting Street behind the old paper mill site in St. Marys, there are two boat ramps and a floating fishing dock.

St. Marys Street

A boat ramp and floating fishing dock can be found next to Howard Gilman Memorial Park in downtown St. Marys.

Kingsland

Located on U.S. Highway 17 at the Georgia-Florida state line south of Kingsland, a public boat ramp offers access to the St. Marys River.

Browntown

This boat ramp and floating fishing dock are located on Temple Creek Road west of the Kingsland. Adjacent is a small park with sports facilities, restrooms and a pavilion.

Woodbine

Access to the Satilla River can be found at the water-front park in Woodbine, off U.S. Highway 17 just north of downtown. A floating fishing dock can be found alongside the boat ramp. Nearby are picnic tables and restrooms.

White Oak

This boat ramp, located off U.S. Highway 17 North just outside Woodbine, also offers public access to the Satilla River with a floating fishing dock, playground area, riverfront benches and swings, picnic tables, a covered pavilion and a raised stage area.

Harrietts Bluff

This area east of Interstate 95 Exit 7 offers public access to the Crooked River and a floating fishing dock.





Cornelia Jackson Memorial

Located on 15th Street in Woodbine, this park has a screened pavilion complete with a full-service kitchen that can be used for family gatherings, cookouts or birthday parties. There is also a large playground area, picnic tables with grills and restrooms. The park has a lighted basketball court and a football field.

Browntown Wilderness Park

This park is located on Temple Creek Road in Browntown, west of the Kingsland city limits. This park offers a nature trail, multi-use fields, basketball court, playground, restrooms and pavilion with picnic tables and a kitchen. Adjacent to the park are a boat ramp and floating fishing dock.

Woodbine 110 Park

This popular community park in Woodbine offers a baseball field, football

field, lighted tennis court, basketball court, playground and restrooms.

Satilla Waterfront Park

Woodbine has a nature trail and riverwalk along the Satilla River. There's a boat ramp and a floating fishing dock, covered areas perfect for having a picnic, public restrooms, bike racks, parking facilities and an old railroad trestle that extends over the Satilla River for a delightful view. Just off the riverwalk is a newly constructed mountain bike trail.

Woodbine Lions Park

The Lions Club recreation field is located on the corner of Brewster Avenue and Crestview Drive in Woodbine and offers a large multi-use field and the new Sgt. Kevin Barber Memorial Dog Park that includes obstacles.

Woodbine Theatre Park

Situated on Bedell Avenue, this newer

park offers a walking trail with exercise stations throughout.

Little Catfish Creek

This park is located south of downtown Kingsland on U.S. 17 and offers a playground and picnic tables.

Kingsland Lions Park

Located on South Grove Boulevard, this facility has baseball fields, T-ball fields, lighted tennis courts, basketball court, a skateboard park, a half-mile walking path, playgrounds and restrooms. It is also the site of Justin's Miracle Field, a special rubberized baseball field for special-needs children.

Maple Ford Park

Located north of Woodbine in Waverly on Spring Bluff Road, this park offers a baseball field, basketball court, a screened in picnic area with several tables and a full kitchen and restrooms.





To register a vehicle, the owner should bring the title or finance papers, current out-of-state registration, name of insurance company and policy number, current odometer reading from the vehicle and identification on title transactions.

Georgia law requires all auto tags be renewed by the owner's birthday. Tags can be renewed up to 30 days prior to the birth date.





Camden's history

Founded in 1777, Camden has been a part of many major moments in America's past

County, despite the area's major decades.

From the county's role in the War of 1812 to its involvement in the paper industry to its possible future as a commercial spaceport site, it's difficult to imagine that Native Americans once dominated the landscape.

The area has significant ties to the past, having been touched by most of the major events in American history.

Camden County

Named for Charles Pratt, Earl of Camden, the county was one of the eight original counties in Georgia and is regarded as one of the earliest Georgia settlements. It was formed in 1777 by the combining of two royal parishes, St. Thomas and St. Marys.

But the earliest record of Camden County was penned by the French explorer Jean Ribault, who came to the New World in the 1550s. The Spanish are credited with settling the area after migrating from St. Augustine, Fla., in 1566 to establish missions along the Atlantic coast.

When the Civil War erupted, Camden

istory is alive and well in Camden County residents were called upon to serve the Confederacy, and many young growth over the last three men left home to become soldiers. Their absence, however, left the coast vulnerable to attack.

> Camden's coast was attacked in both the War of 1812 and the Civil War. A recent archaeological dig confirmed that the last battle of the War of 1812 occurred at a fort on Point Peter in St. Marys. British soldiers took the fort and occupied it beginning in January 1815, just a month after the war had officially concluded. However, it took months before word of the peace treaty between the United States and Great Britain reached troops on the other side of the Atlantic.

The county produced one of the illustrious generals of the Civil War in William Joseph Hardee, who taught at West Point and wrote the book on infantry tactics later used by both armies.

After the Civil War, the Great Depression hit Camden as it did every American community. The opening of Gilman Paper Co. in the 1940s helped the area recover, as did the build-up of Kings Bay Naval Submarine Base in the 1970s and 1980s. In 2002, the paper mill closed for good.

St. Marys

Much evidence of St. Marys' rich history can be found in its downtown historic district, which has been on the National Register of Historic Places since 1976.

The city was founded in 1787 by Jacob Weed, who made his home on 1,620 acres along Buttermilk Bluff. By 1848, the city boasted a courthouse, five churches, three ministers, three lawyers, nine dry goods stores and three schools.

The railroad came in 1906, and this launched the St. Marys shrimping industry, a pogy plant, a canning plant and several sawmills.

Orange Hall, a tourism destination today, was built in 1838 by the Rev. Horace Pratt. Other historical sites include the Washington Pump and Oak, Oak Grove Cemetery, established in 1780, and the Riverview Hotel, constructed in 1916 along the waterfront and still operating today.

Kingsland

While Kingsland is known as "The City of Royal Treatment," it is not named for a monarch, but for the King family, who were early settlers. The city was founded by William Henry King in 1894 with





the coming of the railroad. Since the railroad went through his property, it used "King's Land" as the name for the new stop. The city incorporated in 1908.

The nation's first Maine to Miami road, known in Georgia as the Dixie Highway, opened in 1912, the same year Kingsland's streets were graded and kerosene lights were installed in the business district. Today, the Dixie Highway is officially called U.S. Highway 17. Where it runs through Kingsland, it is also known as Lee Street.

Today, Kingsland is a regular stop for travelers along Interstate 95, as exits 1, 3 and 6 boast a plethora of convenience stores, hotels and eateries. The city is also home to the award-winning Camden County High School as well as the countywide recreation center and campuses for the College of Coastal Georgia and Coastal Pines Technical College.

Woodbine

Woodbine's earliest history revolved around a plantation along the banks of the Satilla River, which was granted by the state in 1808.

The town was formed in 1894 when J.K. Bedell granted the railroad land easements through his plantation in exchange for the right to name the new community. Bedell chose the name Woodbine for a flowering vine that grew abundantly in the area. The town incorporated in 1908, and George W. Brandon, an ancestor of former St. Marys mayor Jerry Brandon, was its first mayor. Woodbine became the county seat in 1923.

Today, it welcomes tens of thousands of residents and visitors each year for the city's annual crawfish festival. The event features crawfish étouffée and a crawfish boil as well as other food vendors, live entertainment and crafts vendors, all set along the banks of the scenic Satilla River and Woodbine Riverwalk.
