



POST-RENOVATION CLEANUP: What's Included in Your Flat Rate

When the contractors leave, we step in. Here is exactly what our heavy-duty post-renovation deep clean includes for your designated project space:

Phase 1: The Rough Sweep (Prep & Debris)

-  **Small Debris Removal:** Gathering and bagging all leftover minor construction waste (stray screws, nails, wood shavings, tape, and packaging).
-  **Protective Film Removal:** Peeling protective plastic off new fixtures, glass, and appliances.
-  **Initial Heavy Vacuum:** Using industrial-strength suction to pull up the heaviest layers of sawdust, dirt, and grit from all flooring before fine dusting begins.

Phase 2: Fine Dust Eradication (The Deep Clean)

-  **Wall & Trim Wipe-Down:** Dry or damp wiping all walls (depending on paint finish), baseboards, door frames, and trim to remove clinging drywall powder.
-  **Cabinet & Drawer Detailing:** Vacuuming and wiping down the inside, outside, and top of all newly installed cabinetry (where sawdust always hides).
-  **Air Vent Clearing:** Vacuuming just inside the floor and wall register vents to catch fallen construction debris before it circulates.
-  **High-Dusting:** Wiping down light fixtures, ceiling fans, and high shelving.

Phase 3: Surface Finishing (The Reveal)

-  **Fixture & Surface Scrubbing:** Detailed wiping of all new countertops, sinks, and backsplashes to remove stubborn adhesive residue or light grout haze.
-  **Glass & Mirrors:** Streak-free cleaning of interior windows, window tracks, and mirrors within the renovated space.
-  **Final Floor Prep:** A final detailed wet mop or specialized hard-floor cleaning to remove the very last traces of dust footprints.

Important Note on Scope of Work:

Our flat-rate covers the intense detailing required to make your space livable. It does not include hauling away heavy bulk construction materials (large drywall slabs, lumber, or old appliances) or cleaning rooms entirely outside of the agreed-renovation zone.
