Updates/Discussion/Strategy

- 3. Chair Report, Green Ridgewood Highlights since last meeting (David) It's been a busy month. Revised agenda to include Schedler discussion.
- 4. Village Council Liaison Report (Pam) 10 minutes
 Schedler: Testing company report at last night's VC meeting on 4 contaminants that they sampled and sent to a lab in the berm.
 - The first three contaminants marginally exceed the standards. Benzopyran requires more testing and attention for remediation actions (\$350K bonded). Because of the contamination, the application to the historic office will be paused.

Ridgewood Water: bonded for two more PFOS removal facilities. Also installed new filters in schools.

Army Corp of Engineers are coming to do a presentation on June 17th at 7:30pm @ Village Hall.

Bike lanes to be painted to take advantage of the paving and construction that is currently going on.

5. Storm Water Ordinance (Joan/Pam) – 10 minutes

Joan presented the storm water ordinance to the village council. We proposed making the changes mentioned below and we are waiting for the vote.

Major development was defined as area of disturbance negotiated down to half an acre. Also regulated that a disturbance of 200 Sq feet would need to double the quantity of water captured from the previous standard.

Green infrastructure will be required to get a yearly permit. In the case where it's created to offset impervious surface

Idea to partner with a professor in Rutgers to train us in Rain Gardens. Train the trainer - potential that we can work to replicate.

- 6. Schedler Berm Contamination (Pam/David) 10 minutes Unknown scope of the testing. At the moment, we don't have details of the full report, only headlines highlighting some contaminants appearing to be exceeding standards. On Saturday June 8th there is an open house from 11am-2pm.
- Climate Fresk –May 15th (David) 5 minutes
 Eighteen people attended. Not everyone invited joined, but we did have people from
 Bergen County that work for County Exec Tedesco. Also, people from the Planning Board
 and some Village Council members (Weitz, Vagianos, and Perron). Great educational
 experience.

Considering opening it up to residents, we need at least two more GR members to get trained. Will send a survey to our distribution list.

Raising questions about Climate Fresk for students or potentially the teachers.
