Tropical Storm Nicole is expected to make landfall along the Brevard County coast (as of 11/8/22) between the night of Wednesday, November 9, 2022 and the morning of Thursday, November 10, 2022 as a Category 1 Hurricane. In preparation, Brevard County Emergency Services will be opening 4 shelters on Wednesday at 9am for a recommended evacuation of anyone in flood prone/low lying areas, the barrier islands, mobile/manufactured homes, or those who are health compromised and need electricity. This is not a mandatory evacuation. If interested in evacuation, the closest shelter will be at Max K. Rodes Park, 3410 Flanagan Ave, West Melbourne, FL 32904.

The Town of Melbourne Village will be issuing a local state of emergency, effective at 10am on Wednesday, November 9, 2022. The Town Offices will be closed for the impending storm beginning at 12pm on Wednesday, Nov 9– Thursday, Nov 10. They will remain closed on Friday, Nov 11 for Veterans Day. Staff will wait for an all clear from the Sheriff's Office before coming into the Town to make assessments. If necessary, public works staff will report on Friday to clear roadways. All other maintenance will resume on Monday.

Sandbags are currently available. Bags may be picked up in the Town Office and sand is available at the maintenance barn on Hall Rd. Also, our yard waste disposal site is currently open at the maintenance barn until a week post storm. As a reminder, this site is for organic yard debris only – no other items are permitted.

WastePro services will be suspended through Friday with the intention of resuming on Saturday, November 12, 2022. Debris piles should not be placed under power lines or in swales/culverts.

In case of emergency, please call 911. For non-emergency calls, call the Brevard Sheriff's South Precinct at 321-952-6371.
