Ladies and Gentlemen,

The idea of presenting three short plays in an evening instead of one long one is far from original. In fact, if one looks back over the years, one finds that the 'triple bill' formula has been used, with varying degrees of success, since the earliest days of the theatre. Latterly, however, that is during the last quarter of a century, it has fallen from favour. Occasionally still a curtain-raiser appears in the provinces but wearing a sadly hang-dog expression, because it knows only too well, poor thing, that it would not be there at all were the main attraction of the evening long enough.

Its spirit is further humiliated by the fact that the leading actors treat it with the utmost disdain, seldom leaving their star dressing-rooms to glance at it, let alone play it. Therefore it has to get along as well as it can in the hands of small-part actors and understudies who, although frequently far more talented and charming than their principals, have neither the name, authority nor experience to triumph over rustling programmes, banging seats and a general atmosphere of bored impatience.

A short play, having a great advantage over a long one in that it can sustain a mood without technical creaking or over-padding, deserves a better fate and if, by careful writing, acting and production I can do a little towards reinstating it in its rightful pride, I shall have achieved one of my more sentimental ambitions.

From our point of view behind the footlights the experiment will obviously be interesting. The monotony of repetition will be reduced considerably and it is to be hoped that the stimulus the Company and I will undoubtedly derive from playing several roles during the week instead of only one, will communicate itself to the audience, thereby ensuring that a good time be had by all.

All of the plays included in the programmes have been written especially. There has been no unworthy scuffling in cupboards and bureau drawers in search of forgotten manuscripts and no hurried refurbishing of old, discarded ideas.







Director's Note

Nine plays over three weekends, 74 characters with 17 actors... they are mad, they said, and perhaps we are - but we like nothing more than a challenge, and the amazing writing and talent of Sir Noël Coward made the job less of a challenge than expected.

His characters literally jump from the page, they are full and rounded and a joy to play and direct. His style of writing keeps your interest from the beginning through to any twist at the end, and the one-act play 'theme' means the evening is full of his wit, songs, drama and fun with not only one play but three!

In the words of Sir Noël himself -

The primary object of the scheme is to provide a full and varied evening's entertainment for theatregoers who, we hope, will try their best to overcome any latent prejudices they may have against short plays and at lease do us the honour of coming to judge for themselves

PARIS ARNOLD

Paris has been acting since he was a child, including a memorable early performance as an alien, covered in gold face paint.

A childhood English teacher inspired a love of Shakespeare, and Paris has subsequently appeared in dramatic performances (including multiple Shakespeare productions) across the UK.

These have involved live donkeys, lively audiences, love, death, comedy and despair.

After a time working abroad (in a non-theatrical career) he's thrilled to be back in England. Last year he returned to a world of Shakespeare, appearing with The Players Theatre Company as Oberon in an outdoor production of A Midsummer Night's Dream. At the end of 2023, he was regularly murdering and being murdered as Macbeth with Berkhamsted Theatre Company.



BAKER

Ash started performing 14 years ago when he joined his local barbershop harmony choir. Since then, he's placed in the national top 10 quartets twice, won 4 national choir championships and represented the UK twice in international competitions in Las Vegas — he is due to represent the UK again in Cleveland, Ohio, in July this year.

Ash loves a challenge, and the thought of bringing several characters to life in such a short space of time is one he couldn't pass up — especially when they're as well written and witty as the ones Noel Coward has created here.
