- Develop a list of facts of at least twenty (20) with up to ten additional for extra credit
- Categories listed facts into five categories plus up to three additional extra credit

Position Paper:

Proposition:

Monopolies Are Beneficial To The American Economy and Support American Economic Growth

Assignment:

Student will submit a 3-6-page paper defining, outlining and supporting their position on this proposition.

Scope:

- Provide a complete and effective definition of the proposition (How are you defining the proposition? How do you define the terms "beneficial" and "growth", for instance? What does it mean to you?)
- Based upon your definition, provide a discussion outlining your position on the proposition (agree, disagree or some other viewpoint). Remember your discussion needs to be consistent with your definition. Make sure your discussion is supported with concise arguments making use of clear economic concepts along with any valid and supported interpretations of these ideas. Supporting information must be specific and illustrated with graphical information. . Be specific in your arguments with supporting detailed explanations.

Requirements:

- 3-6 pages of text (does not include graphs); doubled spaced; no more than 12 font with 1" margins (on all sides-top as well)
- Use and analysis of at least two economic graphs (although more are encouraged) illustrating the position being taken
- Properly cited with at least two sources (while you can use the textbook it cannot be included as one of the two sources)
- Properly formatted bibliography
- Entire paper must be typed (computer generated- including graphs)
