Ice Fishing Words Of Wisdom From Blaise

My favorite time of the year, when the ice gets safe enough to walk on. Don't get me wrong, I like any time of the year you can go fishing. But when the ice forms it's time to get the auger out and go perch. Lake St. Clair and lake Simcoe in Canada would be the 2 best place in North America to search for jumbo perch in my opinion. Over the last 20 years I've learned how to jig long silver spoons with hard beads called Guster or Slab Grabbers to catch limits of monster perch. These lures a meant to be fished close to bottom, using a quick 6 to 12 inch lift and let it flutter back down. Most perch will hit it on the drop or just as it goes still. Electronics play a great role in today's perching, it can tell you if the perch are interested in your presentation or the action you are giving the lure. I like to use 4 rods with different lure and work the fish until I see a preference of one or another. Perch are usually bottom oriented dwellers but they can be pulled off bottom when you caught your last fish. They will follow the last 1 you hooked, up to the top or close to it, these are feeders and are easy to catch. Pay attention to your sonar, it will tell you where they are in the water column. Just remember to move often until you find active fish, or if you are fishing in a group watch the way the group moves to stay on active perch. This is what I call leap frogging, where you move out in front of the direction the school is moving. I have seen large group of fisherman stay with an active school for our a half mile. That's fun fishing

Remember ice is never safe, take a few precautions. Wear a floatable suit or life jacket, get some ice picks, a throwable cushion with 50 feet of rope are a few I never leave shore with out. I hope to see you on the ice maybe our Detroit Steelheaders event in Mitchells Bay CA. or Higgins lake.



2017 DAS Boat Trolling

The 2017 DAS Boat Trolling Tournament (BTT) schedule will consist of 7 events with the best 4 scores of those counting toward Skipper of the Year. The skipper with the least amount of points for 4 events will receive the DAS Skipper of the Year jacket and trophy at the Annual Christmas meeting in December 2017.

Tournament fees remain at \$10 per tournament and there is no annual fee discount. A New Big Fish pool structure will have (3) separate pools available - \$10 per boat for Big King, \$5 per boat for Big Steelhead and \$5 per boat for Big Lake Trout. You have to enter all three pools to participate. The largest fish in each pool wins the entire amount entered for that pool. In the event that no fish is entered in any particular pool, a winner will be drawn from the names entered in that pool. CT'S Salmon Cakes



Ingredients:

3tsp olive oil
 1 small onion, finely chopped
 1 stalk celery, finely diced
 2 tbsp chopped fresh parsley
 1½ cups cooked salmon
 1 large egg, lightly beaten
 1½ teaspoons Dijon mustard
 1¾ cups breadcrumbs,
 ½ tsp freshly ground pepper

Preheat oven to 450°F. Coat a baking sheet with cooking spray.

Heat 1½ teaspoons oil in a large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Add onion and celery; cook, stirring, until softened, about 3 minutes. Stir in parsley; remove from the heat.

Place salmon in a medium bowl. Flake apart with a fork; remove any bones and skin. Add egg and mustard; mix well. Add the onion mixture, breadcrumbs and pepper; mix well. Shape the mixture into 8 patties, about 2½ inches wide.

Heat remaining 1½ teaspoons oil in the pan over medium heat. Add 4 patties and cook until the undersides are golden, 2 to 3 minutes. Using a wide spatula, turn them over onto the prepared baking sheet. Repeat with the remaining patties.

Bake the salmon cakes until golden on top and heated through, 15 to 20 minutes. Meanwhile, prepare Creamy Dill Sauce. Serve salmon cakes with sauce and lemon wedges.

Make Ahead Tip: Prepare through step 3. Cover and refrigerate for up to 8 hours.

To make fresh breadcrumbs: Trim crusts from firm sandwich bread. Tear the bread into pieces and process in a food processor until coarse crumbs form. One slice makes about ½ cup.

Easy cleanup: Recipes that require cooking spray can leave behind a sticky residue that can be hard to clean. To save time and keep your baking sheet looking fresh, line it with a layer of foil before you apply the cooking spray.

D.A.S Scholarship Winner

The Detroit Area Steelheader's Fisheries and Wildlife Scholarship

In 2016 we partnered with the Lake Superior State University Foundation to establish the Detroit Area Steelheaders Scholarship. The DAS Scholarship is an annual \$1000 award available to students studying fisheries and biological sciences at Lake Superior State University. Applicants are evaluated and recommended by faculty, then approved by the foundation. Our initial \$3000 donation represents a three year commitment to the LSSU Foundation. We hope to make additional donations to maintain a \$1000 scholarship award.

The first recipient is Brendon O'Dell from Hale, Michigan. Brendon shares a little bit about himself, in the excerpt from his thank you letter below.

..."I grew up an avid outdoorsman, and have always had a passion for it. I decided because I have such a love for the outdoors I should have an occupation that involves my passion.



It was an easy decision coming to Lake Superior State University (LSSU) because of their incredibly successful fisheries and wildlife management program. My current major is fisheries and wildlife management with a wildlife concentration, and a geographic information systems minor.

While attending the university the last couple years, I have become a member of the Fisheries and Wildlife Club. This club has given me opportunities to receive hands on experience with techniques required for future jobs. The club has also provided opportunities to attend professional meet and greets as well as the ability to attend professional conferences and events that allows me to connect with professionals to create a network of contacts for future employment. Last summer I had an employment opportunity to work with the U.S. Forest service as a park ranger at Lumberman's Monument.
