Tough weekend at Ludington

The DAS skippers and crew anticipated a great weekend of fishing. The marine forecast looked promising for the entire weekend. There were reports of a 37# and 41# fish caught earlier in the week. Many fish over 30# had been weighed in at Captain Chucks recently and 20# fish seemed common. South winds during the week had pushed warm water into the area so we knew the fish would be deep. We went north to pre-fish Friday morning and set up past the stick in about 120 fow. The first hour had us untangling lines a couple of times when a 250 copper went with a nice 20# king. We went out to 180 fow and found a sharp temperature break about 90 to 95 down. We fished till 11:00 and ended up 6 for 7 with a nice box of fish. We figured we had a good program for the next day's tournament. We planned to go back out again in the afternoon but things changed. The wind switched to the north and the waves kicked up. Saturday's forecast now indicated 15 to 20 knot winds out of the north. So much for having established a program from pre-fishing. At the Captain's meeting, we had thirteen boats register. The tournament was postponed until Sunday due to lake conditions and a small craft advisory. There was a good turnout for lunch. Everyone enjoyed the chicken, coleslaw and baked beans from KFC. Sunday morning the lake had settled down. The abbreviated fishing period would run from 6:00 AM to11:00 AM. We went north again and found the temp break now around 50 fow. Things started great for us with first a 200 copper and then a 12 color lead core taking nice fish. The 9:00 fish call had us with 5 fish in the box, Bobby's Toy with 4, and Tyger with 3. A couple of boats had 2 with the rest either 1 or 0. At the weigh in, Sloppy Joe took first place with 88.60 points, Tyger second with 86.30, and Bobby's Toy third with 72.10. Big fish pool money went to Bad Dog with a nice 25# plus King that hit a Yellow Sparkle spinny and Mirage fly. Sloppy Joe the weighed only Lake Trout, and via a drawing (with no Steelhead caught), Bobby's Toy took the big Steelhead money.

## Fishing Lake Granby in Granby Colorado!

On August 8, 2017 while vacationing with my family in Colorado my brother Dave, son-in-law Jim and I went out for Lake Trout on Lake Granby in Colorado. Lake Granby is in the middle of a chain of lakes in the Granby area and all of them are deep and cold. The method for this time of year is jig fishing much the same as we do for Walleye on the rivers at home. The difference is you are jigging 90 feet of water with a 3/8 oz jig. It is a little tricky finding bottom and staying there. Once we got the hang of it we began catching Lake Trout. As you can see in the picture they are not 10 lb lunker's but they were fun to catch and last night's dinner was pan fried Lake Trout with olive oil, oregano, and lemon pepper. Very good. Between catch and release, smally's, and keepers we caught a total of 18 and brought 7 to the dock. A very good trip Dan Chisholm (Channing)







#### Manistee Tournament August 26th

## **Holland Tournament**

The Detroit Area Steelheaders headed to Holland Michigan the last weeken in July. The fishing was tough due to the weather during the week of the tournament. Five skippers showed up to give Holland a shot. A total of 14 fish were caught in Holland. Lake Buzzard found some nice fish early. Fred ended up with 3 fish for the tourney. Team Bad Dog took the crown. Bad Dog traveled way south about 17 miles of Holland. Our fish came in the 160 to 190 foot of water range. High Lines were working for the steelies. Meat rigs on dipseys and coppers also worked well. Bad Dog Finished with 5 Fish total, 2 Steelhead 2 Kings and 1 Coho. One of Toms Steelheads weighed in at 8.15lbs to take the Big steelhead pool. Lake Buzzard took big fish pool with his 15.70 lb King he also had a 15.65lb king. Big Lake Trout was taken in by Vicki's Secret for 6.70lbs. Top 3 places were team Bad Dog at 1st, Lake Buzzard at 2nd and Vicki's Secret in 3rd. Lunch Was provided by Daddios Carryout. Special thanks to Churches Tackle, Perrin Brewing Company, and Dreamweaver Lure Company for the wonderful prizes they donated to our club.

## **Braised Fish Pot Roast Style**

## INGREDIENTS

• 3 tablespoons olive oil

• 1 ½ to 2 pounds monkfish tail, halibut steak or really any type of fish as thick as possible and preferably in one piece

- Salt and pepper
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 thyme sprigs
- 1 pinch saffron, optional
- 3 medium carrots, cut into 1inch chunks
- 1 small fennel bulb, cut into chunks
- 1 pound potatoes, cut into 1inch chunks
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 1 teaspoon smoked paprika (pimentón)
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup red wine
- 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cups beef or chicken stock

Chopped fresh parsley for garnish.

## PREPARATION

1. Put the olive oil in a Dutch oven over medium-high heat. When it is hot, sprinkle the fish with salt and pepper, and add it to the pot. Cook, undisturbed, until it is well browned, 5 or 6 minutes. (If you're using halibut fillet, and it has skin, brown the nonskin side.) Transfer it to a plate, browned side up.

2. Add the onion, thyme, saffron, carrots, fennel and potatoes; sprinkle with salt and pepper. Cook, stirring occasionally until the onion begins to soften, about 5 minutes. Add the tomato paste and smoked paprika, and cook, stirring, until the tomato paste darkens a bit, 2 or 3 minutes. Add the wine, scraping up any browned bits from the bottom of the pot, and let it bubble away until it almost disappears.

3. Add the stock, bring to a boil and let it bubble vigorously until the liquid reduces by about a third, about 10 minutes. Adjust the heat so the mixture simmers; when the vegetables are nearly tender — about 10 minutes later — nestle the fish, browned side up, among the vegetables; keep the browned crust above the liquid. Cook, undisturbed, until the fish and vegetables are tender, 10 to 15 minutes.

Transfer the fish to a cutting board, and divide the vegetables among shallow bowls. Slice the fish and put it on top of the vegetables. Taste the cooking liquid, and adjust the seasoning; ladle it over all, garnish with the parsley and serve.
