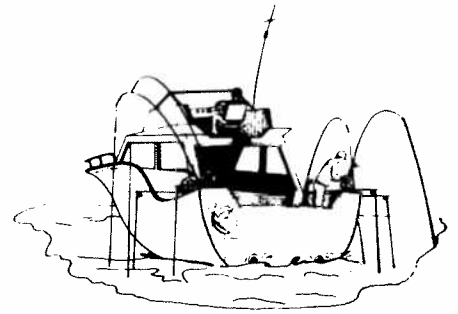

## LADIES DAY TOURNEY SET FOR SEPT. 16

If you missed last year's Ladies Day Tournament, be sure not to miss this year's event, which will be held at Oscoda on Saturday, September 16. This year, we're hoping to have an even larger turnout than in 1977, when 26 boats and 85 individuals took part.

Jack Brewer, owner of Main Pier Marina will really roll out the red carpet for us this year, and Main Pier will be our headquarters for the entire event.

## Sunday action at Pentwater

After sitting in the parking lot for most of Saturday, listening to the wind, the crew of the "Okie Drifter" was very anxious to get started Sunday morning.



We ran straight out from the breakwall to 35 feet of water and started setting lines. We stacked two rods on each of the outside downriggers, using home-made alligator clip releases. One highline was put out over the center of the stern, for a total of seven rods.

We have been experimenting with running two lines from the same rod, and an eight pound lake trout hit the upper lure just as the "Sea Screw" shut down a short distance away.

By the time lines were re-set, we were in 50 feet of water, so we turned back to shore and checked the water temperature. A surface temperature of 65°, with

# Rules for 1978 Ladies Day Tournament

THE UNUSUAL TACKLEBOX

# Lure tapes + Imagination = Success

I've been called everything from the "lure tape freak" to the "prism-god", only because I'm not afraid to put lure tape on anything! One look in my tackle box would prove that. To look at some of my baits, you would think such things don't exist, but in my box, anything and everything is possible. Here are just a few ways to increase the variety of your baits.

First, you'll need a healthy supply of lure tape, consisting of various colors. Also, standard hand punches, preferably three (3) different sizes, a pair of small sharp scissors, and some single edge razor blades.

After rounding up all of the above, you're ready to start producing some very effective baits which will increase your catch.

We'll start with J-plugs. Using the large punch, punch out seven to eight polka dots for each J-plug. Combinations I have found that work well include lime green with dark green dots, chartreuse with red or black dots, pink with hot pink or red dots, and blue with dark blue dots.

Also, J-plugs with strips of tape on each side work quite well using those same color combinations. Silver scale on blue, purple and green J-plugs is another good combination. Note: keep the strips narrow - wider at the head and tapering down to the tail.

Next, we'll get into Flutterspoons, Manistee Wobblers, Andy Reekers and Lucky-Lures. The back sides of these lures is a great place to start using tape, my favorites being silver and gold prism tapes. Changing colors if you don't already have them is to place your tape so the straight edge runs through the center of the bait, then trim with your razor around the contour. Remember to open up the holes at each end so your hooks and split ring can move freely. Using your small punch, you can change just the color of the dots if you would like to.

Dodgers play a big part when attractors are required. Half and half is tops, although cleaning brass can be a pain. A good solution to that problem is lure tape. An all-chrome dodger with gold tape on half of each side works just as well, if not better. Also, all-chrome dodger with silver prism tape cut in the shape of a fish works well, and half and half chrome with silver tape is terrific! Don't overlook your weights: Herbies and Tommys with tape on the sides are great.

These are just a few ideas! I'm sure that with a little faith and a wild imagination, you too will be thrashing the waters with some far-out creation, just slaying the fish.

By all means, if you find something that works tell someone about it. You'll be surprised how much he'll tell you!

### SALMON BALL

- 2 cups canned salmon - homemade or "store bought"
- 1 8 oz. package cream cheese
- ¼ cup finely-chopped onions (more if desired)
- ½ cup chopped nuts (more if desired)
- 1 tsp. lemon juice (optional)

Blend ingredients.  
Shape into ball.  
Roll in crushed nuts and shape into ball.

Our July tournament turned out to be the biggest so far this year, with thirty-five boats entering. I think this was mostly from curiosity, as I had many ask, "Where IS Pentwater?"

Friday night found many Steelheaders launching boats and adding those last-minute touches. A lot of the usual questions were being asked, like how far north or south, what depth, which lures were working best, and anything else that might help get a better start on Saturday.

The one question that wasn't asked was how the weather was going to be in the morning. Well, Saturday morning came at 5:00 a.m., and after walking around outside for a few minutes, it was obvious that we would not be starting the tournament early. At breakfast we decided to postpone the start until 12:00 noon.

About 9:30, things started to clear, and it looked as though we might set out. This was a short-lived hope, because at about 10:30 the weather took a turn for the worse. The wind and waves continued to get worse and the tournament was cancelled until Sunday.

With fishing off for the day, it seemed like a good time to catch up on our drinking and swap a few old fish stories. As promised, Mr. Andreae and Mr. Besser rolled out a free keg of beer, and with that we got through Saturday.

The tournament was rescheduled for Sunday, with 1:00 p.m. being the cut-off time. As many of us found out, the storm on Saturday had shifted a lot of cold water around, causing the fish to be scattered and scarce.

It wasn't too scattered for Jerry Thompson and the crew of the "Dar-Dan", who finished first with a very nice catch. Out of thirty-five boats entered, twenty-seven were present with fish at the weigh-in.

I was quite impressed with all the facilities so near and around the 'Rek' & Reef, and other things of interest within easy walking distance of the docks.

Prior to this tournament, I had only been to Pentwater once. But I am sure to return, as I hear the fishing only gets better every day.

# Mullet Lake yields strong summer trout action

We had been trolling for an hour with no action. The depth finder was flashing at 105', showing very little bottom structure and so far, no fish. The temperature profile was 65° surface, 51° at 65', 49° at 75' and 47° from 90' to the bottom.

I had my lines spread from 80'-95', two junk lines and two clean. We decided to troll in towards Red Pine Point which, according to the chart, had some good-looking structure. Also, we figured the fish might be where the 49° to 50° water thermo layer was closer to the bottom.

When we hit 95', I cranked up one junk line just off the bottom and tightened the rod down. Before I could bring up the next rigger, the junk line released and Fish On. Five minutes later, a dark, 5 pound lake trout was in the net. A small chartreuse Fireplug three feet behind a Sun Flash Lake Troll had done the trick.

After resetting that line, the boat was turned and headed back towards the 95' depth. I changed the other junk line to a Heddon Schoolie followed by a chartreuse and black dot Swim Whiz. I put that line down to 89'. The rod was barely in the holder when it went off. My partner set the hooks, and after about

ten minutes, another laker came to the net, this one just over 7 pounds. A few more passes did not produce any more trout, although we had two other knock-offs.

Eventually, we moved out over deeper water, 115' to 120'. This time we marked a few fish down between 90' and 105'. I lowered a green Charger down to 100' and, within five minutes, a 6 pound trout hit it and ended up in my net.

Our last fish, another six pounder, came about an hour later on a white Loco, 96' down. This fish also had a large, fresh Lamprey scar on its side. Three of our four trout were fin-clipped, indicating they were planted fish. Mullet Lake has been planted with good numbers of fingerling lake trout. There are also native trout in the lake.

Last summer, I was fishing the same water at this time of year and caught fish in the 2-3 pound class, most of which couldn't pull the release off at 90'. Now those fish are up in the 6-8 pound class and give a good account of themselves.

After Saturday on the 1st of July, I wasn't able to go out again until Tuesday, July 4th. It was a clear day, and Mullet Lake was calm as a mill pond. The

air temperature was in the seventies. The water temperature profile was the same as it was on Saturday.

I was fishing alone and there wasn't anybody trolling within sight. After taking the water temperature, I put the motor in gear and started setting up two lines.

The first one down was the green Charger. This went ten poles behind the weight and dropped to 96'. I landed two 6 pound trout on that rod before I could get the second line in the water!

It's quite a panic trying to drive the boat, fight a fish, and net it alone. I managed this on four lakers that day and surprised myself by not 'farming' any.

On that day, the active fish seemed to be suspending 5' to 10' off the bottom. They preferred green lures run clean. All four fish were taken while I had no attractors in the water. They also were active in cooler water for that time of year than I've encountered with Great Lakes trout.

I use the same methods in Mullet Lake that work for me in Lake Michigan and Lake Huron.

Mullet Lake is a large body of water, but the trout are mostly concentrated at the south end, and out from the Village of Topinabee. Occasionally, brown and rainbow trout are taken by trollers, and I've also caught a few whitefish while trout fishing in the deep water. A local friend of mine caught a 13 pound laker in Mullet Lake this July, but most of the fish run from 4 to 8 pounds.

If you're interested in trying some inland lake fishing for trout, consider Mullet Lake. It's a beautiful area, and you will have little competition.

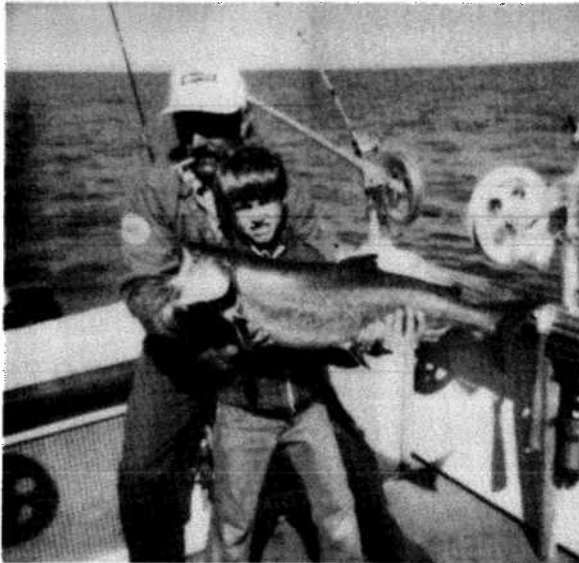
