

The Whitney Drain Follies revisited

It was just about a year ago when I reported the outcome of the first Whitney Drain Surf Tournament. This year's results were just as meager. The story is just about the same; last year the surf was unfishable, this year the surf was barely fishable (safe only if an athletic supporter and cup were worn) — talk about brutal waves! Last year three fish were taken, this year three fish were taken. The surf fishery in the Whitney Drain area continues to baffle and frustrate the surf fisherman. It's either hot or cold. So far we've had 2 years of cold.

We had 33 registered to fish the surf tournament on October 14. The winner was **Brian Glaser**, with a 7 lb. 10 oz. steelhead. Close behind for second place was **Pat Devlin** with a 7 lb. 6 oz. steelhead; and **Ed Yankowski II** took third with a 6 lb. steelhead. The rules for this tournament were a trophy for the largest steelhead, brown, laker, coho and chinook.

Brian hooked the winning fish in the Drain itself, and after a see-saw battle, he announced it was time to net the fish (Is beaching fish out of fashion this year?). Anyway, who but our stellar Prez Luckritz pops up with a net and no waders. But he did have a net! Elton then proceeded to amaze and entertain us with the "Sterling Heights swoop, splash, shovel and drop-kick" technique of "landing" a fish. As the golfers say, it doesn't matter how the ball goes in as long as it goes in. It is unbelievable what that man can do to the bottom of a river with a net. We all watched from the surf awaiting the gravel and rocks to finish dropping from the sky to see if the Drain would

take another course out to the lake.

St. Joe tourney happens December 2nd

Due to the great interest shown by the members of the club, another river tournament has been scheduled against the St. Joe Chapter on their own river. There will be 3 trophies awarded to the 3 largest fish caught by our chapter. Limit one (1) trophy per angler. There will be beer and chili after the weigh-in at the "Grove" in Berrien Springs. The weigh-in will be held at Shamrock Park. The winning Chapter will be determined by the weight of the 15 largest fish caught by each Chapter. Entry fee is \$5.00 and the losing Chapter pays for the beer.

The St. Joe is basically a boat river, but good bank fishing is found from the dam down through Shamrock Park. For those of you who bank fish or wade, there are some real good gravel runs near the bridge, where steelhead are taken on spawn, wigglers, Corkies, Spin & Glos, spinners, etc.

From the dam to the river mouth yields some super runs and holes which are very accesible by small boat. Dropback fishing, trolling and rolling spawn will take many of these fresh-run steelies. Tadpollys, Flatfish and Hot-n-Tots are three real hot baits which take some big fish.

There are two real good boat ramps: one at Berrien Springs at Shamrock Park, and another right under I-94. There will be no check-in point and the Honor System will be expected.

Starting time will be daylight and the tournament goes till 3:30 P.M. Weigh-in will be from 3:30 through 4:30 P.M. at Shamrock Park. For further information, contact Gary Gray or Bob Ksionzek at the November meeting or by phone. All fishermen must be pre-registered prior to December 1st. Hope to see you on the river December 2nd.

IMPORTANTI

By - Laws changes

The Detroit Area Chapter is governed by a set of rules and regulations called By-Laws. When By-Laws changes are proposed, the changes must be approved by the general membership. You will be asked to vote on the following By-Law changes at the November 28 Membership Meeting.

Article III Section 1 (current)

The Directors shall be divided into three classes, who shall be elected and hold office for a term of three (3) years each, their terms expiring respectively on the date of the annual meeting each year, or when their successors are elected.

Article III Section 1 (proposed change)

At the December meeting seven (7) Directors will be elected, two (2) for a term of two years and five (5) for a term of three years.

Article IV Section 5 (current)

He (treasurer) shall submit a detailed report at the annual meeting of the financial condition of the Chapter for the preceding fiscal year.

Article IV Section 5 (proposed change)

He (treasurer) shall submit a detailed report of the Chapter's financial condition for the preceeding fiscal year at the meeting following the annual membership meeting (January).

Article IV Section 6 (current)

The Officers of the Association shall serve for a term of one year following their election, and no Officer shall be elected to any office for more than two consecutive terms.

Article IV Section 6 (proposed change)

The Officers of the Association shall serve for a term of one year following their election. The President and Vice-President shall not hold office for more than two consecutive years.

Article III Section 9 (current)

Article III Section 9 (proposed change)

Directors are not eligible to participate/win the boat raffle or any other raffle sponsored by the Detroit Area Chapter.

The above is in conjunction with our "By-Laws Amendment" rule which states, "These by-laws may be amended or supplemented by a vote of two-thirds of the voting members of the Chapter present and entitled to vote at any meeting of the membership, provided the proposed amendment or amendments shall be mailed to all."






