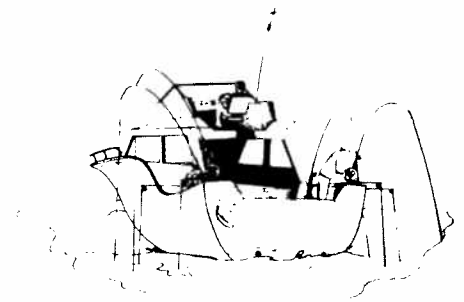

First two-day tourney set for May 26 & 27

Our second trolling tournament of the season will be held at South Haven on May 26 and 27. This will be our first two-day tournament and, hopefully, the weather will co-operate. The tournament will run from 6:00 A.M. to 2:00 P.M. both days.

On May 26, after the weigh-in, there will be a get-together at the park on the hill just north of the South Haven Municipal Marina. All entrants as well as their families are invited. It should start about 4:30 to 5:00 P.M. Each family should bring their own beverages and side dishes. We are asking for donations of fish for our main dish, cooked over open flame by our master chef Jerry Lee.

Skippers' meetings will be held at the Municipal Marina as well as at the launch area both days. You must pick up your weigh-in sheet and fill it out prior to the day's tournament. Dock space and accommodations will be limited because of the Memorial Day weekend. You may call the Chamber of Commerce in South Haven at 1-616-637-1450 for a list of motels. For those camping, there is a State Park site six miles south of South Haven and a private park just north of the city limits.

As the water temperature will change as the weather warms up, we will try to keep an accurate fishing report on the Club Hot Line as to the fishing at South Haven. Most fish seem to be taken in the top forty feet at this time of year. Best colors are chartreuse, green, blue and silver and all the fluorescent colors. Atwell triumphs at first 1979 boat tourney

The first of the six boat trolling tournaments was held April 21st on the St. Clair River. The mid-April weather was cool, but with a lot of warm hearts, 42 Detroit Area Chapter boats left their ports hoping to yell what may have been the first "Fish-On" for the season.

Lines were set at 7:00 A.M. with a lot of anxious hands hoping to put that first 1979 fish in the box. For some boats it came quick but for others it came slow.

After a total of seven hours of fishing, lines were pulled at 2:00 P.M. and boats headed for the weigh-in at the River Crab Restaurant. A total of 35 fish were caught by the Detroit Chapter, mostly Cohos and Kings ranging from one pound up to 14 pounds.

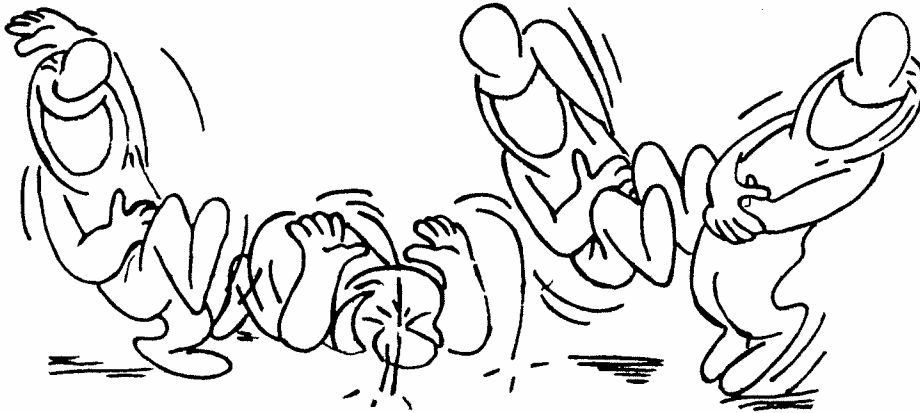



Hamilton proposes '80 Port Sanilac

This sleepy village was all set for the hordes of Detroit Steelheaders who were to fish here the weekend of April 28th when Mother Nature again sent her weather against our research trips.

Saturday dawned below freezing, with moderate winds from the north-east. Waves started out at 2 feet and gradually built to 3 feet by the afternoon. This cloudy day was also to bring some scattered rain and *SNOW*.

However, we do have some hardy members. Chester (the marine owner), said over 20 boats were launched, but that many had left by noon. At 4:00 p.m. eight boats weighed in 30 fish (our thanks to Schommer's Sports Shop in Port Sanilac for the use of their scale).

The 22 Kings, 5 Cohos, 2 Lakers and 1 Brown totaled over 178lbs (about 6lb. average fish). The largest King was 17½ lbs., largest Laker 7¼ lbs., Coho 5lbs. and the largest Brown was 9lbs.

The "Sally E" and "Okie Drifter" both took over 40lbs. of fish. After the weigh-in, 23 of us had a hot meal at the Blue Water Inn, catered by Mary's Diner.

For the boats that fished Sunday, the sunny, clear and calm weather was just what the doctor ordered. The 3 boats that weighed fish Sunday, caught 7 fish totalling 42½lbs.; 2 Browns (7½ and 10 lbs.), 2 Kings, 1 Laker, 1 Coho and 1 Steelhead.

According to the fishing logs completed Saturday, most fish were caught by

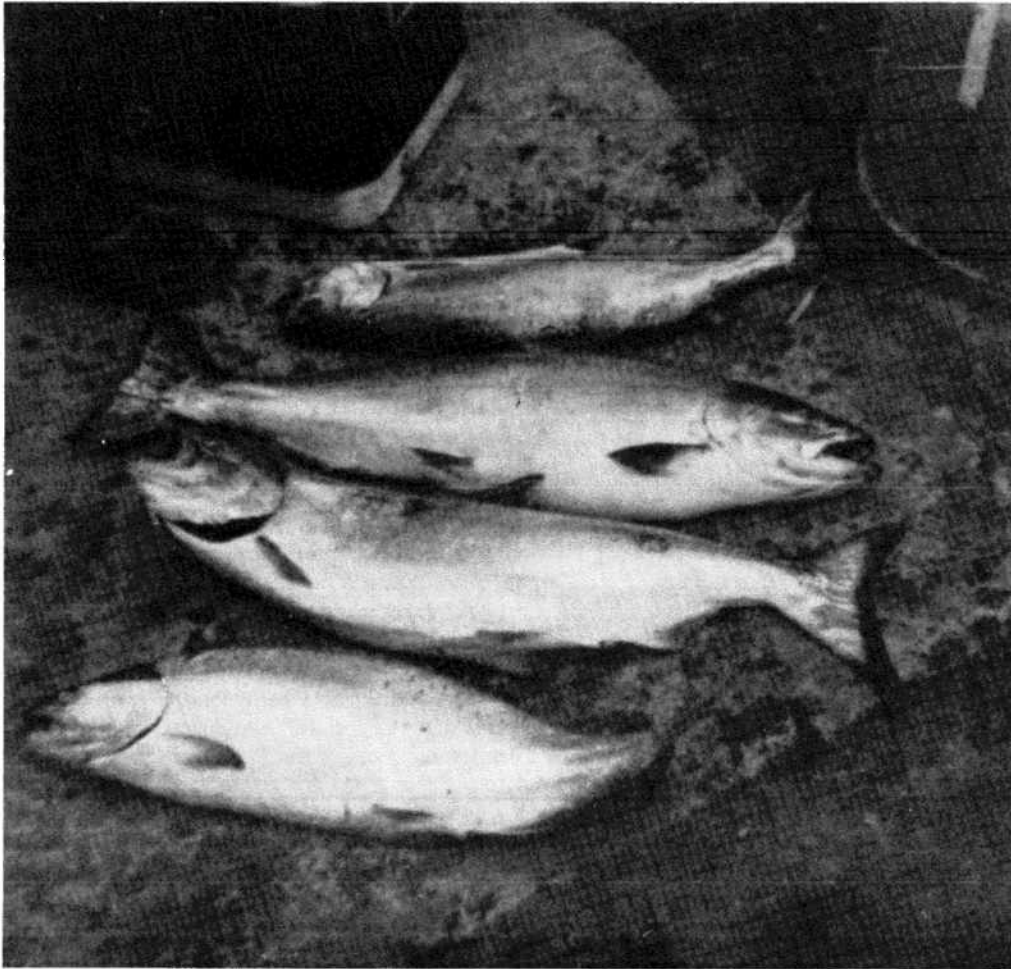

lac tourney after 2nd good trip



THESE FOUR KING SALMON, TOTALING approximately 42½ pounds, were the result of Saturday's fishing by the skipper and crew of "Okie Drifter" during the Port Sanilac Research Trip April 28 and 29. The largest king exceeded 14 lbs.

10:00 a.m. but some were taken throughout the afternoon. The best lures were J-11 orange Rapalas, black and silver Rebel and Rapala, blue and silver Rapala, chartreuse and red dot flutter- spoon, and a few on the J-Plug. Fish were taken in 12'-28' of water, mostly in 22'. The lure depth ranged from the surface down to 20'; the fish were scattered in depth. The lures were trolled from 30' to 200' behind the boat (depending upon lure depth); the average distance behind the cannonball was 60'. Most fish were caught trolling South, with the wind.

My boat fished only South rather than fight the winds and waves. This gave us greater control over our speed and lines. We then ran back North to follow the same procedure.

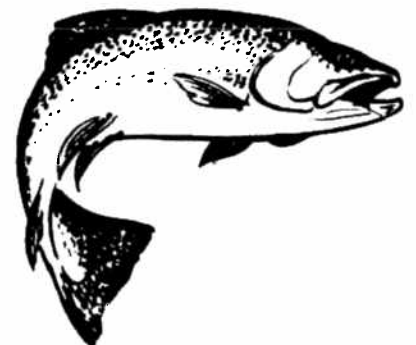
The pound test of the lines ranged from 6lbs to 20lbs., with the average at 8lbs.


The surface water temperature was 43° to 45°, with warmer water in shallow.

From the past two years' research, I will make the following recommendations:

1. We have an annual tournament or Spring outing at Port Sanilac.
2. The best conditions are when the surface water is 45° to 48°.
3. These conditions seem most likely to be found the first weekend in May.
4. Use the afore-mentioned lures, depths, etc.
5. Since the fish are scattered top to bottom in 30' or less of water, fish far enough above the bottom so as not to waste time hanging up on the rocky shoals.
6. And, say "Hello" to Chester at the Marina for me.

VHF radio channel restrictions are listed

A lot of us either already have, or are contemplating equipping our boats with 55 channel VHF radios. Before using one of these sets you should have a basic understanding of which channels you can and cannot use and under what conditions you can use them. If you don't, you could find yourself receiving 'greetings' from the F.C.C.

Each channel in your set has an assigned specific purpose and everyone has operational restrictions imposed by F.C.C. regulations. These channels fall into three basic groups: those authorized for pleasure boat use; those restricted to necessary communications; and those unauthorized for pleasure boat use.

The first group, those intended for pleasure boat use, includes Channel 9 for pleasure and commercial intership and ship-to-coast communications, Channels 68, 69, 70, 71, 72 and 78A, used for public intership or intership and coast-to-coast communication and the marine operator channels 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 84, 85, 86 and 87. Also included in this group is Channel 16 which has three uses. The primary use of this channel is as a distress frequency. Its secondary use is

for safety communications such as storm warnings and navigational messages. The third use of Channel 16 is for contacting other vessels. The Coast Guard constantly monitors Channel 16. Channel 15, a receive-only channel for weather information, is also in this group.

The second group include those restricted to necessary communications and can be used by pleasure boats only when relaying information about navigational hazards, weather information, etc. Also included in this second group are two channels that appear on all radios but have very specific uses — those being Channel 6 and 22A. Channel 6 is designated only for essential intership safety communications and Channel 22A is to be used only for Coast Guard authorization after initial contact on Channel 16.

The third group of channels are those designated for commercial use only. The only exception to this would be those pleasure boats being on duty with the Coast Guard Auxiliary and having written permission to use this group.

'Reformed' perch fisherman learns about steelheading

On Friday, August 4, 1978, two friends of mine (Skip and Dennis Essenmacher) asked my wife Pamela and I to join them fishing at Grindstone City. We left at 4:00 p.m. Friday and spent the night at a relative's house in Harbour Beach. In the morning we gave his 21 ft. Robolo "Sundowner" a final check and then headed for Grindstone City. At 7:45 a.m. we were in the water heading for the drop off.

Pamela and I had never fished for anything but perch before, so we were in for quite an experience. Being with two experienced Detroit Chapter Steelheaders and hearing how club members really unite on the water, I felt that we would be putting fish in the box.

I was watching the rods when at 8:45 a.m. the line released. "Fish On!", I yelled, Dennis brought in a nice Steelie about 7 lbs. After watching Dennis bring the fish in, Pam would be next. Within the next two hours, Pam and I lost a total of 7 fish. Due to inexperience, we didn't keep the rod tips up.

The next action we got was at 2:00 p.m. This time it was Skip's turn. He brought in a nice 9 lb. Brown.

Pam and I were amazed at these fish. They were beautiful. Fifteen minutes later, the line released again and I took action. As soon as I reeled in the slack, the fish took off, taking about 100 yards of line. Being excited, I yelled, "How do I make it stop?!" Skip said, "You don't." Then the fish surfaced and after a short battle I brought it in. It was a King Salmon weighing 16 lbs. 8 oz. and was 35 inches long. We were in 150 ft. of water and the fish hit the lure at 105 feet. It was the most thrilling fishing experience I had ever had.

To all members who participated. And a *special thanks* to Don White, our tournament registrar, for all his time and involvement.

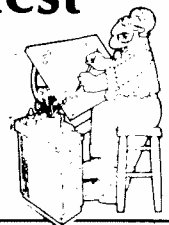

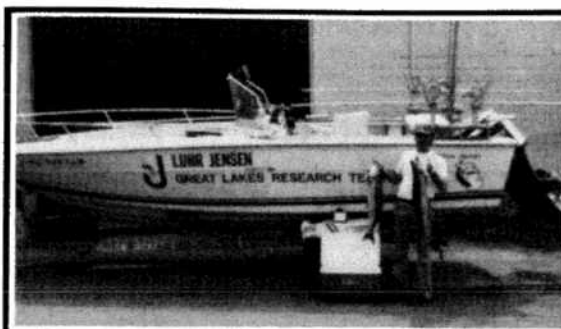
